DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 21-12-16.

Synopsis: Next generation Hoosier educators scholarship. Changes the eligibility requirements for the next generation Hoosier educators scholarship and provides that a student may qualify for the scholarship by achieving a cumulative grade point average upon graduation of at least a 3.75 on a 4.0 grading scale during grades 9, 10, 11, and 12. Requires the commission for higher education to give priority to an individual who is: (1) a recent high school graduate; (2) pursuing a teacher shortage area; (3) showing significant financial need; or (4) a member of a household with an annual income of not more than the amount required for the individual to qualify for the free or reduced price lunch program as determined for the immediately preceding taxable year.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning higher education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 21-12-16-5, AS AMENDED BY P.L.92-2020,
2	SECTION 101, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS
3	[EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2021]: Sec. 5. (a) An applicant who is enrolled
4	in an accredited postsecondary educational institution after June 30,
5	2017, may qualify for a scholarship under this chapter. To qualify for
6	a scholarship, an applicant must:
7	(1) apply for a scholarship on a form supplied by the commission;
8	(2) except as provided in subsection (b), have graduated from an
9	Indiana nonaccredited nonpublic or state accredited high school
10	accredited under IC 20-31-4.1 and: either:
11	(A) graduated in the highest twenty percent (20%) of students
12	in the applicant's high school graduating class; or
13	(B) received a score in the top twentieth percentile on the SAT
14	or ACT examination; or
15	(C) achieved a cumulative grade point average upon
16	graduation of at least 3.75 on a 4.0 grading scale (or its
17	equivalent if another grading scale is used) for courses



1	taken during grades 9, 10, 11, and 12;
2	(3) have participated in school activities and community service
3	activities during high school;
4	(4) have applied to and been accepted for enrollment in an
5	accredited postsecondary educational institution approved by the
6	commission under section 10 of this chapter;
7	(5) agree in writing to:
8	(A) obtain a license to teach under IC 20-28-5; and
9	(B) teach for at least five (5) consecutive years in a public
10	school or an eligible school (as defined in IC 20-51-1-4.7) in
11	Indiana after graduating with a baccalaureate degree from the
12	accredited postsecondary educational institution described in
13	subdivision (4); and
14	(6) meet any other criteria established by the commission.
15	(b) A student who graduates from a nonaccredited nonpublic school
16	must meet the requirement described in subsection $(a)(2)(B)$ in order
17	to meet the eligibility requirement described in subsection $(a)(2)$.
18	SECTION 2. IC 21-12-16-6, AS ADDED BY P.L.105-2016,
19	SECTION 1, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
20	JULY 1, 2021]: Sec. 6. (a) The commission shall consider each
21	application and determine the eligibility of the applicant for the
22	scholarship. The commission shall give priority to recent high school
23	graduates, students pursuing teacher shortage areas as described in
24	34 CFR 682.210(q)(6), and students showing significant financial
25	need when selecting applicants.
26	(b) The commission shall also give priority to an individual who
27	is a member of a household with an annual income of not more
28	than the amount required for the individual to qualify for the free
29	or reduced price lunch program under the national school lunch
30	program as determined for the immediately preceding taxable year
31	for the household for which the individual was claimed as a
32	dependent.
