## DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

**Citations Affected:** IC 14-8-2; IC 14-31-4.

**Synopsis:** Designated wild areas. Provides that 13 specified areas within certain state forests are designated wild areas. Specifies certain activities that are prohibited or allowed within a designated wild area. Establishes responsibilities for the department of natural resources and divisions that manage designated wild areas.

**Effective:** July 1, 2015.

# HOUSE BILL No. 1580

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning natural and cultural resources.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:*

1 SECTION 1. IC 14-8-2-68.3 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE  
2 AS A **NEW** SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY  
3 1, 2015]: **Sec. 68.3. "Designated wild area" for purposes of**  
4 **IC 14-31-4, has the meaning set forth in IC 14-31-4-2.**

5 SECTION 2. IC 14-8-2-318.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA  
6 CODE AS A **NEW** SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS  
7 [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2015]: **Sec. 318.5. "Wild area" for purposes**  
8 **of IC 14-31-4, has the meaning set forth in IC 14-31-4-3.**

9 SECTION 3. IC 14-31-4 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE AS  
10 A **NEW** CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY  
11 1, 2015]:

12 **Chapter 4. Designated Wild Areas**  
13 **Sec. 1. The general assembly finds the following:**  
14 **(1) It is necessary and desirable that some large forested areas**  
15 **of Indiana where there are few permanent improvements or**



1 human habitations, the landscape is relatively natural, and the  
 2 imprint of human activity is not predominant, be set aside as  
 3 wild areas and preserved for the benefit of present and future  
 4 generations.

5 (2) That the large and relatively undisturbed forested areas  
 6 are a part of the defining heritage of the state, and securing  
 7 these areas will provide the people of the state of Indiana  
 8 important opportunities for solitude and recreation, including  
 9 hiking, camping, picnicking, and hunting.

10 Sec. 2. As used in this chapter, "designated wild area" means a  
 11 wild area listed in section 4 of this chapter.

12 Sec. 3. As used in this chapter, "wild area" means a tract of  
 13 relatively undeveloped state owned land that:

14 (1) has retained in significant part its natural forested  
 15 character;

16 (2) presents outstanding opportunities for solitude or  
 17 recreation compatible with the preservation of the wild  
 18 character of the land; and

19 (3) has at least eight hundred (800) acres of contiguous state  
 20 controlled land.

21 Sec. 4. The following wild areas are designated wild areas:

22 (1) The area of the Owen-Putnam State Forest known as the  
 23 Cataract Wild Area, containing approximately one thousand  
 24 six hundred eighty (1,680) acres that is contained within the  
 25 following property compartment and tract boundary maps  
 26 prepared by the department before January 1, 2015:

27 (A) Within Owen-Putnam compartment 2, tracts 1 through  
 28 4.

29 (B) Within Owen-Putnam compartment 4, tracts 1 through  
 30 14, tract 15 (partial), and tract 16 (partial).

31 (2) The area of the Harrison-Crawford State Forest known as  
 32 the Cold Friday Wild Area, containing approximately three  
 33 thousand nine hundred fifty (3,950) acres that is contained  
 34 within the following property compartment and tract  
 35 boundary maps prepared by the department before January  
 36 1, 2015:

37 (A) Within Harrison-Crawford compartment 7, tract 1.

38 (B) Within Harrison-Crawford compartment 23, tract 12  
 39 (partial), and tract 13.

40 (C) Within Harrison-Crawford compartment 24, tract 2,  
 41 and tracts 5 through 7.

42 (D) Within Harrison-Crawford compartment 29, tracts 1



- 1 through 10, and tracts 17 through 20.  
 2 (E) Within Harrison-Crawford compartment 30, tract 2  
 3 (partial), and tracts 3 through 11.  
 4 (F) Within Harrison-Crawford compartment 31, tract 1  
 5 (partial), and tracts 2 through 9.  
 6 (3) The area of the Harrison-Crawford State Forest known as  
 7 the Hellbender Wild Area, containing approximately two  
 8 thousand four hundred sixty (2,460) acres that is contained  
 9 within the following property compartment and tract  
 10 boundary maps prepared by the department before January  
 11 1, 2015:  
 12 (A) Within Harrison-Crawford compartment 12, tract 8.  
 13 (B) Within Harrison-Crawford compartment 13, tract 9  
 14 (partial).  
 15 (C) Within Harrison-Crawford compartment 18, tract 3  
 16 through 4.  
 17 (D) Within Harrison-Crawford compartment 19, tract 1  
 18 (partial), tract 2 through 4, tract 5 (partial), tract 6  
 19 (partial), tract 7 (partial), tract 8 (partial), and tracts 9  
 20 through 11.  
 21 (E) Within Harrison-Crawford compartment 20, tract 1  
 22 (partial), tract 2, tract 3 (partial), and tracts 4 through 7.  
 23 (F) Within Harrison-Crawford compartment 26, tracts 1  
 24 through 3.  
 25 (4) The area of the Clark State Forest known as the  
 26 Knobstone Wild Area, containing approximately five  
 27 thousand six hundred eighty (5,680) acres that is contained  
 28 within the following property compartment and tract  
 29 boundary maps prepared by the department before January  
 30 1, 2015:  
 31 (A) Within Clark compartment 12, tracts 6 through 9.  
 32 (B) Within Clark compartment 14, tract 1, and tracts 3  
 33 through 4.  
 34 (C) Within Clark compartment 15, tracts 1 through 6,  
 35 tract 7 (partial), tract 9 (partial), tract 10 (partial), tract 11  
 36 (partial), tract 12 (partial), and tracts 13 through 14.  
 37 (D) Within Clark compartment 16, tract 1 (partial), tract  
 38 2 (partial), tract 4 (partial), and tracts 5 through 12.  
 39 (E) Within Clark compartment 17, tracts 1 through 5.  
 40 (F) Within Clark compartment 18, tracts 1 through 2, tract  
 41 3 (partial), and tract 7 through 9.  
 42 (5) The area of the Clark State Forest known as the Leota



- 1 Wild Area, containing approximately three thousand four  
 2 hundred fifty (3,450) acres that is contained within the  
 3 following property compartment and tract boundary maps  
 4 prepared by the department before January 1, 2015:
- 5 (A) Within Clark compartment 2, tracts 1 through 14, and  
 6 tract 15 (partial).
- 7 (B) Within Clark compartment 3, tracts 1 through 6, tracts  
 8 8 through 10, and tract 12.
- 9 (C) Within Clark compartment 4, tract 2, and tract 14.
- 10 (6) The area of the Morgan-Monroe/Yellowwood State Forest  
 11 known as the Low Gap Wild Area, containing approximately  
 12 three thousand seven hundred fifty (3,750) acres that is  
 13 contained within the following property compartment and  
 14 tract boundary maps prepared by the department before  
 15 January 1, 2015:
- 16 (A) Within Morgan-Monroe compartment 9, all tracts.
- 17 (B) Within Morgan-Monroe compartment 15, tracts 1  
 18 through 10.
- 19 (C) Within Yellowwood compartment 13, tracts 1 through  
 20 4, tracts 6 through 8, tract 15, and tract 16 (partial).
- 21 (D) Within Yellowwood compartment 14, tract 1, tract 2  
 22 (partial), tract 3 (partial), tract 6 (partial), tract 21, tract  
 23 22 (partial), tracts 23 through 25, tract 26 (partial), and  
 24 tract 28 (partial).
- 25 (7) The area of the Yellowwood State Forest known as the  
 26 Miller Ridge Wild Area, containing approximately two  
 27 thousand three hundred thirty (2,330) acres that is contained  
 28 within the Yellowwood property compartment and tract  
 29 boundary map prepared by the department before January  
 30 1, 2015, within Yellowwood compartment 3, tract 2, tracts 4  
 31 through 19, tract 20 (partial), tracts 21 through 22, tract 23  
 32 (partial), tract 24 (partial), and tracts 25 through 34.
- 33 (8) The area of the Yellowwood State Forest known as the  
 34 Mossop Ridge Wild Area, containing approximately two  
 35 thousand eighty (2,080) acres that is contained within the  
 36 Yellowwood property compartment and tract boundary map  
 37 prepared by the department before January 1, 2015, within  
 38 Yellowwood compartment 2, tracts 2 through 5, tracts 7  
 39 through 18, tract 20 (partial), tracts 21 through 27, tract 29,  
 40 tract 32 (partial), tracts 33 through 35, and tract 37 (partial).
- 41 (9) The area of the Jackson-Washington State Forest known  
 42 as the Orchard Ridge Wild Area, containing approximately



1           one thousand two hundred seventy (1,270) acres that is  
 2           contained within the following property compartment and  
 3           tract boundary maps prepared by the department before  
 4           January 1, 2015:

5           (A) Within Jackson-Washington compartment 3, tract 19  
 6           (partial), tract 20, tract 21 (partial), and tracts 22 through  
 7           23.

8           (B) Within Jackson-Washington compartment 4, tract 3  
 9           (partial), tract 4, tract 5 (partial), tracts 6 through 7, tracts  
 10          9 through 10, tract 11 (partial), tract 12 (partial), tract 13  
 11          (partial), tract 14, tract 15 (partial), tract 16, tract 18  
 12          (partial) and tracts 19 through 21.

13          (10) The area of the Morgan-Monroe State Forest and  
 14          Yellowwood State Forest known as the Scarce-O'-Fat Wild  
 15          Area, containing approximately three thousand six hundred  
 16          eighty (3,680) acres that is contained within the following  
 17          property compartment and tract boundary maps prepared by  
 18          the department before January 1, 2015:

19          (A) Within Morgan-Monroe compartment 17, tract 12  
 20          (partial), tracts 9 through 11, tract 18, and tract 23.

21          (B) Within Yellowwood compartment 8, tract 6 (partial),  
 22          tract 7, tract 8 (partial), tract 9 (partial), tract 10 (partial),  
 23          tracts 11 through 29, tract 30 (partial), and tract 31  
 24          (partial).

25          (C) Within Yellowwood compartment 9, tract 1 (partial),  
 26          tracts 2 through 15, and tract 16 (partial).

27          (11) The area of the Ferdinand State Forest known as the  
 28          Siberia Wild Area, containing approximately nine hundred  
 29          ninety (990) acres that is contained within the Ferdinand  
 30          property compartment and tract boundary maps prepared by  
 31          the department before January 1, 2015, within Ferdinand  
 32          compartment 15, tracts 2 through 10.

33          (12) The area of the Jackson-Washington State Forest known  
 34          as the Spurgeon Hollow Wild Area, containing approximately  
 35          four thousand (4,000) acres that is contained within the  
 36          following property compartment and tract boundary maps  
 37          prepared by the department before January 1, 2015:

38          (A) Within Jackson-Washington compartment 9, tract 6  
 39          (partial), tract 8 (partial), tracts 10 through 14, and tracts  
 40          16 through 26.

41          (B) Within Jackson-Washington compartment 10, tracts 1  
 42          through 9, tract 10 (partial), tracts 11 through 25, tract 26



1 (partial), tracts 27 through 32, and tracts 37 through 41.  
2 (13) The area of the Jackson-Washington State Forest known  
3 as the Starve Hollow Wild Area, containing approximately  
4 one thousand five hundred (1,500) acres that is contained  
5 within the following property compartment and tract  
6 boundary maps prepared by the department before January  
7 1, 2015:

8 (A) Within Jackson-Washington compartment 5, tract 3  
9 (partial), and tracts 4 through 14.

10 (B) Within Jackson-Washington compartment 6, tracts 1  
11 through 4, tract 5 (partial), tract 6 (partial), tracts 7  
12 through 8, tracts 10 through 11, tract 12 (partial), and  
13 tract 13 (partial).

14 Sec. 5. Before January 1, 2016, the department shall prepare  
15 and keep on file accurate maps and legal descriptions of each  
16 designated wild area.

17 Sec. 6. The department shall manage a designated wild area in  
18 a manner that preserves the area's natural values and relatively  
19 undisturbed character.

20 Sec. 7. (a) Any division established under IC 14-9-4 that  
21 managed a wild area before its designation as a designated wild  
22 area shall continue to manage the designated wild area unless the  
23 duties to manage the designated wild area are transferred by the  
24 commission.

25 (b) Subject to the requirements of this chapter, a division that  
26 manages a designated wild area may continue to use the land for  
27 the purposes and activities, including hunting, fishing, and  
28 trapping, for which the land was initially held. The division may  
29 place limits on access to or equipment used in a designated wild  
30 area as needed to protect the designated wild area from  
31 deterioration or overuse.

32 (c) A designated wild area must be managed in a manner to  
33 preserve its natural values and relatively undisturbed character.

34 Sec. 8. If a wild area provided an easement or access to private  
35 property or a cemetery either into or through a wild area before  
36 becoming a designated wild area, the department shall continue to  
37 allow the easement or access to the private property or cemetery.

38 Sec. 9. (a) The department shall post conspicuous signs on the  
39 perimeter of the designated wild area indicating that the area is a  
40 designated wild area.

41 (b) The department may post signs in a designated wild area  
42 summarizing permitted and prohibited activities and marking



- 1 trails.
- 2 **Sec. 10. (a) Subject to subsection (b), the following is prohibited**
- 3 **in a designated wild area:**
- 4 (1) **Removing, cutting, picking, or altering vegetation, except**
- 5 **with the written consent of the department:**
- 6 (A) **to create or maintain public access;**
- 7 (B) **to maintain easements that were created before the**
- 8 **area became a designated wild area;**
- 9 (C) **for scientific or educational purposes; or**
- 10 (D) **as permitted in section 11 of this chapter.**
- 11 (2) **Exploring for or extracting minerals.**
- 12 (3) **Logging.**
- 13 (4) **Energy development, including wind energy, solar energy,**
- 14 **oil and gas development, and gathering or harvesting wood**
- 15 **for biomass combustion.**
- 16 (5) **Use of motorized vehicles.**
- 17 (6) **Building roads. However, the department is not prohibited**
- 18 **from maintaining a road that existed before the area became**
- 19 **a designated wild area.**
- 20 (7) **Granting utility easements.**
- 21 (8) **Commercial enterprises, except for guided hikes or field**
- 22 **trips.**
- 23 (9) **Use of motorized equipment.**
- 24 (10) **Use of permanent structures other than those necessary**
- 25 **to minimize damage from trail use, including erosion bars,**
- 26 **steps, and bridges.**
- 27 (11) **Use of herbicides.**
- 28 (b) **Subsection (a) does not prohibit activities needed to:**
- 29 (1) **provide emergency medical assistance;**
- 30 (2) **conduct search and rescue;**
- 31 (3) **control a fire;**
- 32 (4) **monitor and control invasive species; and**
- 33 (5) **monitor and control plant and wildlife diseases.**
- 34 **However, the department shall use methods that are the most**
- 35 **narrowly directed to the situation and as least intrusive to the**
- 36 **designated wild area as possible.**
- 37 **Sec. 11. (a) Any recreational use in a designated wild area must**
- 38 **be managed to maintain the area's wild character. The department**
- 39 **may allow the following recreational uses in a designated**
- 40 **recreational area:**
- 41 (1) **Mountain biking and horseback riding on trails that allow**
- 42 **those uses.**



- 1           **(2) Hiking.**
- 2           **(3) Gathering of edible and medicinal plants and mushrooms**
- 3           **when in season and as permitted by law.**
- 4           **(4) Overnight camping at campsites identified by the**
- 5           **department with appropriate limits regarding term of**
- 6           **occupancy.**
- 7           **(b) The department may require a permit to enter a designated**
- 8           **wild area or to engage in an activity listed in subsection (a) in a**
- 9           **designated wild area.**
- 10          **Sec. 12. The commission shall adopt rules under IC 4-22-2**
- 11          **concerning the management and use of designated wild areas**
- 12          **consistent with the requirements of this chapter.**
