## HOUSE BILL No. 1598

A BILL FOR AN ACT concerning state and local administration and to make an appropriation.

### Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1 SECTION 1. [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2019] (a) There is 2 appropriated to the victim services division of the Indiana criminal 3 justice institute established by IC 5-2-6-8(a): 4 (1) one million five hundred thousand dollars (\$1,500,000) 5 beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020, and 6 (2) one million five hundred thousand dollars (\$1,500,000) 7 beginning July 1, 2020, and ending June 20, 2021; 8 from the state general fund for the division's use in providing 9 programs and treatment for the prevention of human trafficking. 10 (b) This SECTION expires July 1, 2021.
