A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.


Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1 SECTION 1. IC 20-20-47 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE 2 AS A NEW CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE 3 JULY 1, 2023]: 4 **Chapter 47. Skilled Trades Pilot Program and Fund** 5 Sec. 1. As used in this chapter, "fund" means the skilled trades 6 pilot program fund established by section 5 of this chapter. 7 Sec. 2. As used in this chapter, "pilot program" means the 8 skilled trades pilot program established by section 4 of this 9 chapter.

Sec. 3. As used in this chapter, "skilled trade" means any occupation that requires a particular skill set, knowledge, or ability.

Sec. 4. (a) There is established a skilled trades pilot program for the purpose of providing funds to one (1) or more school corporations to implement a program that introduces students in grades 6 through 8 to skilled trades.

(b) The department shall administer the program.

1	Sec. 5. (a) The skilled trades pilot program fund is established
2	for the purposes of implementing the pilot program described in

4	(b) The fund consists of the following:
5	(1) Appropriations by the general assembly.
6	(2) Interest deposited in the fund under subsection (e).
7	(3) Gifts, grants, devises, or bequests made to the department

10	(d) The expenses of administering the fund shall be paid from

18	Sec. 6. (a) To participate in the pilot program, a school
19	corporation must:
20	(1) apply to the department in the manner and on a form
21	prescribed by the department; and
22	(2) meet any requirements established by the department.
23	(b) The department may approve a school corporation to
24	participate in the pilot program if the school corporation meets the
25	requirements under subsection (a).
26	Sec. 7. Not later than July 1, 2024, and not later than July 1 each
27	year thereafter, the department shall:
28	(1) collect and compile information concerning the pilot
29	program under this chapter; and
30	(2) submit the report described in subdivision (1) to the
31	following:
32	(A) The governor.
33	(B) The legislative council, in an electronic format under
34	IC 5-14-6.
35	Sec. 8. The state board may adopt rules under IC 4-22-2
36	necessary to implement this chapter.
37	Sec. 9. This chapter expires July 15, 2026.
