

ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL No. 1616

DIGEST OF HB 1616 (Updated March 16, 2015 12:13 pm - DI 104)

Citations Affected: IC 12-17.2.

Synopsis: Eligibility for child care voucher. Provides that beginning October 1, 2015, a child who is otherwise eligible for participation in the federal Child Care and Development Fund voucher program may continue to participate unless the child's family income exceeds the greater of 250% of the federal income poverty level or 85% of the state median income for the same size family.

Effective: July 1, 2015.

ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL No. 1616

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning human services.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 12-17.2-3.4 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
2	AS A NEW CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3	JULY 1, 2015]:
4	Chapter 3.4. Child Care and Development Fund
5	Sec. 1. The definitions in IC 12-17.2-3.5 apply throughout this
6	chapter.
7	Sec. 2. As used in this chapter, "CCDF" refers to the federal
8	Child Care and Development Fund voucher program administered
9	under 45 CFR 98 and 45 CFR 99.
0	Sec. 3. Beginning October 1, 2015, a child who:
1	(1) receives child care paid for by a CCDF voucher payment;
2	and
3	(2) otherwise meets the eligibility criteria under 45 CFR 98.20
4	for continued payment under CCDF;
5	remains eligible to continue to receive child care paid for by a



- 1 CCDF voucher payment unless the child's family income exceeds
- the greater of two hundred fifty percent (250%) of the federal
- income poverty level or eighty-five percent (85%) of the state
- 4 median income for the same size family.
