DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Synopsis: Same day voter registration. Permits a voter to register at the polls by completing a voter registration form and an affirmation that the individual has not voted elsewhere in the election and by providing proof of residence.

Effective: January 1, 2020.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning elections.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

The election division shall 35 prescribe a standardized coding system to classify documents 36 presented under subsection (a) for entry into the county voter 37 registration system. 38 (c) If an individual is unable to present the documentation 39 required under subsection (a) to the poll clerk while present at the 40 polls, the poll clerk shall notify the precinct election board. The 41 board shall provide a provisional ballot to the individual under 42 IC 3-11.7-2.

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(d) The precinct election board shall advise the individual that 1 2 the individual must file a copy of the documentation required 3 under subsection (a) with: 4 (1) the county voter registration office; or 5 (2) the precinct election board in the voter's precinct; 6 to permit the provisional ballot to be counted under IC 3-11.7. 7 Sec. 3. The commission shall prescribe the affirmation required 8 under section 1(c)(1) of this chapter. The affirmation must include 9 a statement that the individual has not already voted at the election 10 for which the individual is registering to vote. 11 Sec. 4. An individual who registers to vote under this chapter: 12 (1) may not be challenged on the grounds that the individual's 13 registration does not appear in the precinct registration book 14 or poll list; and 15 (2) is not required to obtain a certificate of error under 16 IC 3-7-48 to vote. 17 Sec. 5. Before each primary, general, municipal, school district, 18 or special election, the county election board shall provide each 19 precinct election board with a sufficient number of registration 20 forms, affirmations, and statements to meet the reasonable need 21 for the forms, affirmations, and statements under this chapter. 22 Sec. 6. The precinct election board shall attach the completed 23 registration forms, affirmations, and statements to the poll list for 24 processing by the county voter registration office under 25 IC 3-10-1-31.1. 26 Sec. 7. (a) The precinct election board shall add to the poll list 27 of the precinct the name and address of an individual who registers 28 to vote under this chapter. 29 (b) The county voter registration office shall add to the 30 registration record of the county the name of an individual who 31 registers to vote under this chapter. 32 Sec. 8. The county voter registration office shall process under 33 IC 3-7-33-5 the voter registration forms completed under section 34 1 of this chapter. 35 Sec. 9.
