





HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 2	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION congratulating the Charles A. Tindley Accelerated School's boys basketball team.
3	Whereas, The boys basketball team from Charles A.
4	Tindley Accelerated School, a charter school on the
5	northeast side of Indianapolis, has joined an elite group of
6	athletes for the very first time;
7	Whereas, The Tigers are now basketball state champions;
8	Whereas, Although Tindley's basketball program, guided
9	by head coach Robert Wonnell, has been a very successful
10	program, winning three sectionals, a regional, and
11	semi-state, it had never been able to take that final step;
12	Whereas, On Saturday, March 25, 2017, at Bankers Life
13	Fieldhouse in Indianapolis, it did;
14	Whereas, With just five seconds left in the game, Hunter
15	White launched a bank shot in the lane to give the Tigers a
16	51-49 win over Lafayette Central Catholic in the Class A title
17	game;
18	Whereas, A hard fought battle from the onset, the score was
19	tied four times and the lead changed five times;
20	Whereas, This victory marked the first state championship
21	in any sport in the school's history;
22	Whereas, Although the winning shot can be taken by only

1	one player, this victory was truly a team effort;
2	Whereas, Chris Murff led the Tigers with 13 points, nearly
3	three times his season average, with Sincere McMahon
4	adding 10 points, Eric Hunter 8, Joe Johnson 7, K.J.
5	Coleman 6, Hunter White 5, and Tyler Young 2;
6	Whereas, The Tindley basketball program has been under
7	the watchful eye of head coach Robert Wonnell for 10 years;
8	Coach Wonnell has developed a strong program that will
9	keep the Tigers competitive well into the future;
10	Whereas, Coach Wonnell took over the program in 2007,
11	prior to the Tigers' first full IHSAA campaign, and has taken
12	them from 8-13 that first year, to back-to-back-to-back
13	sectional crowns, to a state championship;
14	Whereas, While the Tigers are all outstanding athletes, they
15	are equally outstanding students;
16	Whereas, Members of the basketball team participate in the
17	Reclaiming the Village Rites of Passage Program that
18	introduces and teaches leadership and life skills and is
19	operated by the External Affairs Department of the Health
20	and Hospital Corporation of Marion County;
21	Whereas, The talent, dedication, hard work, and
22	togetherness of the Tindley Tigers and their coaches have
23	produced outstanding achievements throughout the
24	basketball season, including a 24-5 season record; and
25	Whereas, Outstanding accomplishments such as this
26	deserve special recognition: Therefore,
27	Be it resolved by the House of Representatives
28	of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana,
29	the Senate concurring:
30	SECTION 1. That the members of the Indiana General Assembly
31	congratulate the Charles A. Tindley Accelerated School's boys
32	basketball team on its Class A state championship and recognize its
33	outstanding accomplishments throughout the season. The members also
34	wish the players continued success in all their future endeavors both on
35	and off the basketball court.
