

HOUSE RESOLUTION No. ___

A HOUSE RESOLUTION urging the Indiana Office of Court Services to promote the use and establishment of additional problem solving courts in the State of Indiana.

Whereas, Problem solving courts began during the 1990s to
address addiction, mental health, and other factors that affect
recidivism across the United States of America;

Whereas, The Indiana General Assembly defined "problem solving court" in 2010 and declared that these courts provide "a process for immediate and highly structured judicial intervention" while remaining focused on several key concepts;

11 Whereas, The Indiana General Assembly concluded that the 12 following concepts were critical to the successful operation of 13 all problem solving courts: Enhanced information to improve

1	decision making, engaging the community to assist with
2	problem solving, collaboration with social service providers
3	and other stakeholders, linking participants with community
4	services based on risk and needs, participant accountability,
5	and evaluating the effectiveness of operations continuously;
6	Whereas, The Bureau of Justice Statistics with the U.S.
7	Department of Justice conducted a nationwide study in 2012
8	that found that over 3,000 problem solving courts existed in the
9	United States, with a total of 64 operating in the State of
10	Indiana at that time;
11	Whereas, Current Indiana problem solving courts include:
12	Adult Drug Courts, Domestic Violence Courts, Family
13	Dependency Courts, Juvenile Drug Courts, Juvenile Problem
14	solving Courts, Mental Health Courts, Re-entry Courts, and
15	Veterans Courts;
16	Whereas, Problem solving courts play a critical role in
17	today's judicial system, offering programs and opportunities to
18	address common issues found at the heart of recidivism;
19	Whereas, Indiana's judicial system would benefit from an
20	increase in problem solving courts throughout the state; and
21	Whereas, The House of Representatives urges the Indiana
22	Office of Court Services to promote the use of problem solving
23	courts and work to increase the number of problem solving
24	courts operating in the state: Therefore,
25	Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the
26	General Assembly of the State of Indiana:
27	SECTION 1. That the House of Representatives encourages
28	the Indiana Office of Court Services to promote the use and
29	establishment of additional problem solving courts in the State
30	of Indiana.
31	SECTION 2. That the Principal Clerk of the House of
32	Representatives shall transmit a copy of this resolution to the
33	Executive Director of the Indiana Office of Court Services,
34	Justin Forkner, and the Liaison for the Problem Solving Courts
35	Committee, the Honorable Christopher Goff.
