A HOUSE RESOLUTION recognizing February as Teen	
Dating Violence Awareness Month.	
Whereas, During the month of February, we honor and raise	
awareness for our youth affected by teen dating violence. Teen	
dating violence is a pattern of violent, coercive, or manipulative	
behaviors to gain power and maintain control over another	
person in a relationship;	
Whereas, Indiana faces higher than average rates of teen	
dating violence. One in 10 Hoosier teens face physical violence	
in their relationship, while one in eight have experienced sexual	
violence in their relationship;	
Whereas, Teen dating violence can display itself in multiple	
forms. Teens facing violence in their relationships can face	
physical, sexual, or psychological violence, including stalking

2 Whereas, Violence and aggressive behaviors pervasive in 3 formative intimate relationships can create unhealthy 4 relationship patterns, which often continue throughout life. It 5 is important to address these behaviors to ensure the continued 6 safety of Hoosiers;

- 7 Whereas, Sixteen to 24-year-olds are three times more likely
 8 than any other age group to be a victim of intimate partner
 9 violence;
- 10 Whereas, Teen dating violence can impact youth and 11 families in every community throughout Indiana;

12 Whereas, Placing value and importance on local 13 organizations that work to educate and assist Indiana youth 14 about the signs and effects of unsafe relationships is crucial to 15 ensuring the safety of our teens;

Whereas, The Marion County Prosecutor's Office recognizes
this social problem and has secured a multi-year public grant
to provide a dedicated deputy prosecutor to educate youth on
the issue and prosecute related cases in Marion County;

Whereas, In 2010, the Indiana General Assembly enacted a
law to implement dating violence education programs in grades
6 through 12 and dating violence response policies in Indiana
schools; and

Whereas, We must ensure Hoosier teens have a strong
understanding of healthy and safe relationships because
everyone is deserving of a healthy relationship: Therefore,

Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the
General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. That the Indiana House of Representatives
 recognizes February as Teen Dating Violence Awareness
 Month.
