1925, in Cairo, Illinois. He was the first-born child of William

2	Whereas, He served in World War II from 1941 to 1946 on
3	the U.S.S. Columbia (CL56) special task force and received an
4	honorable discharge. He was awarded the Medal of Honors
5	American Theater, Victory Medal, Asiatic-Pacific Theater 3
6	Stars, Philippine Liberation 3 Stars, European-African-Middle
7	East Theater, and a host of other awards;
8	Whereas, After the war, he returned home to Cairo, Illinois,
9	to finish his college studies at Lincoln College. Due to his
10	recognized dedication and continuous hard work, William was
11	invited to relocate to Indianapolis, Indiana, by a former Navy
12	officer, which led to him becoming employed at Naval Air
13	Warfare Center for more than 10 years;
14	Whereas, William Bruce took his mastered skills and
15	knowledge with him as he later became employed by the United
16	States Department of State at Stout Field, where he held the
17	position of Chief Warehouse Supervisor;
18	Whereas, William received several honors, which included
19	two Sagamore of the Wabash awards from Governor Otis R.
20	Bowen and Governor Evan Bayh for his service to the state of
21	Indiana;
22	Whereas, William Bruce worked diligently and tirelessly and
23	is recognized as the first African American Chief Purchaser for
24	the State of Indiana after 35 years of service;
25	Whereas, William took a second job at the five-star
26	restaurant Chantéclair where he worked for 30 years part time
27	as Head Maitre d'. He received a letter of commendation from
28	Hilton owner Conrad Hilton, Jr., which allowed him to stay at
29	any Hilton properties throughout the United States;
30	Whereas, William was an active member of the National
31	Association for Black Veterans, Inc., the American Legion, and
32	the Veterans of Foreign Wars. He was a lifelong Democrat and
33	was very proud to have lived to see an African American
34	President of the United States, whom he stood in line to vote
35	for;



1 Whereas, On September 9, 2017, William Bruce, while 2 accompanied by his son-in-law, a retired Master Sergeant from 3 the United States Army, was privileged to take one more 4 "military" journey on the Indy Honor Flight to Washington, 5 D.C.;

6 Whereas, William Bruce loved his family and family holiday 7 gatherings, especially on his birthday, Christmas Day. He 8 enjoyed eating good food, especially dessert, playing cards, 9 reading, and discussing sports, the stock market, and business 10 investments. He was an avid Indianapolis Colts fan; and

Whereas, William was the proud father of his only daughter,
Annmarie Byers, (whose husband is Gregory Byers), a proud
grandfather of three grandchildren, Marie, (whose husband is
Timothy Wright), Gabriella, and Gregory-David, and a proud
great-grandfather of three great-grandchildren, Taylor,
Morgan, and Zion: Therefore,
