

HOUSE RESOLUTION No.

Introduced by: Hamilton, Errington

A HOUSE RESOLUTION commending the 100th anniversary of the Izaak Walton League of America, its ideals, and accomplishments.

Whereas, On January 14, 1922, 54 ambitious sportsmen gathered at the Chicago Athletic Club to discuss the deterioration of America's top fishing streams;

Whereas, Wildlife habitat was being destroyed across the country and our nation's forests and wilderness were quickly vanishing. Knowing that urgent action was needed to preserve fish and wildlife habitat, the group formed an organization to combat water pollution and to protect the country's wetlands, grasslands, and forests, a step that would lay the foundation for many conservation victories for decades to come;

Whereas, One hundred years later, the 42,000 members of

the Izaak Walton League of America are building on the successes of those who preceded them in responding to conservation challenges;

Whereas, The League benefitted from the visionary conservation leadership of individuals such as the creator of the federal duck stamp, Ding Darling, the father of modern wildlife management and author of "A Sand County Almanac", Aldo Leopold, and the original proponent of the Land and Water Conservation Fund, Joe Penfold, as well as Indiana leaders like Tom and Jane Dustin, Herb and Charlotte Read, Ethyle Bloch, Mike and Gerry Grimshaw, Ivar Hennings, Jim Daniels, and Chuck Bauer;

Whereas, The League has been at the forefront of every major clean water victory throughout the United States and in Indiana, spearheading the conservation of land and waters for the benefit of all Americans, actively supporting the creation of the Indiana Dunes National Park, the Patoka River National Wildlife Refuge, and the Indiana Nature Preserves Act;

Whereas, The League was instrumental in the first ban on phosphates in detergents in Indiana, defeating nuclear energy in Indiana, and keeping the Wabash River free of dams;

Whereas, The League, since its inception, has been an outspoken advocate for conserving the nation's fish and wildlife as well as for ethical hunting and angling. The League was an early advocate for passing federal legislation to support habitat conservation and restoration with fees paid by hunters, anglers, and recreational shooting sports enthusiasts, an investment that, to this day, benefits wildlife nationwide;

Whereas, The League's more than 20 chapters in Indiana are in communities across the state, working to introduce youth and families to conservation and outdoor recreation. Chapter members build nature trails, restore stream banks, monitor water quality, and plant trees. League chapters also award many scholarships each year to college students working toward natural resource degrees; and

Whereas, The Izaak Walton League of America has
