

## HOUSE RESOLUTION No. \_\_\_\_

Introduced by: Morris

A HOUSE RESOLUTION urging the government of Turkey to cease its discrimination against the Ecumenical Patriarchate of the Orthodox Christian Church.

Whereas, The Ecumenical Patriarchate, located in Istanbul, Turkey, is the sacred See that presides in a spirit of brotherhood over a communion of the self-governing churches of the Orthodox Christian world;

Whereas, The See is led by Ecumenical Patriarch
Bartholomew, who is 270th in direct succession to St.
Andrew the Apostle and holds titular primacy as primus inter
pares, meaning "first among equals", in the community of
Orthodox Christian churches worldwide:

Whereas, In 1994, Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew,

along with leaders of the Appeal of Conscience Foundation,

cosponsored the Conference on Peace and Tolerance, 2 bringing together Christian, Jewish, and Muslim religious 3 leaders for an interfaith dialogue to help end the Balkan 4 conflict and the ethnic conflict in the Caucasus region; 5 Whereas, In 1997, the Congress of the United States 6 awarded Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew a 7 Congressional Gold Medal; 8 9 Whereas, Following the September 11, 2001, terrorist attacks on our nation, Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew 10 gathered a group of international religious leaders to 11 produce the first joint statement with Muslim leaders 12 condemning the attacks as "antireligious"; 13 Whereas, In November 2005, the ecumenical patriarch, 14 15 along with Christian, Jewish, and Muslim leaders, cosponsored the Conference on Peace and Tolerance II to 16 further promote peace and stability in southeastern Europe, 17 the Caucasus region, and Central Asia via religious leaders' 18 interfaith dialogue, understanding, and action; 19 Whereas, The Orthodox Christian Church, in existence for 20 nearly 2,000 years, numbers approximately 300 million 21 members worldwide, with more than 2 million members in 22 the United States; 23 Whereas, Since 1453, the continuing presence of the 24 Ecumenical Patriarchate in Turkey has been a living 25 testament to the religious coexistence of Christians and 26 Muslims: 27 Whereas, This religious coexistence is in jeopardy because 28 the government of Turkey has not recognized the rights and 29 religious freedoms of the Ecumenical Patriarchate, which is 30 considered a minority religion by the Turkish government; 31 32 Whereas, The Turkish government has limited eligibility to hold the office of ecumenical patriarch to only Turkish 33 nationals; 34

Whereas, From the millions of Orthodox Christians living 1 in Turkey at the turn of the 20th century, there are fewer than 2 3,000 of the ecumenical patriarch's flock in Turkey today; 3 Whereas, The Turkish government has not honored its 4 agreement to reopen the Theological School on the island of 5 Halki, closed by the government in 1971, impeding training 6 for Orthodox Christian clergy; 7 Whereas, The Turkish government has confiscated nearly 8 94 percent of the properties of the Ecumenical Patriarchate 9 and has placed a 42 percent tax, retroactive to 1999, on the 10 Hospital of Baloukli and Home for the Elderly, a charity 11 hospital run by the Ecumenical Patriarchate; 12 Whereas, The European Union, a group of nations with a 13 common goal of promoting peace and the well-being of its 14 15 people, began accession negotiations with Turkey on October 16 3, 2005; 17 Whereas, The European Union defined membership criteria for accession at the Copenhagen European Council 18 in 1993, obligating candidate countries to achieve certain 19 levels of reform, including stability of institutions 20 guaranteeing democracy, adherence to the rule of law, and 21 respect for and protection of minorities and human rights; 22 Whereas, The Turkish government's current treatment of 23 the Ecumenical Patriarchate is inconsistent with the 24 membership criteria of the European Union; 25 Whereas. The Turkish government's treatment of 26 Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew affects Orthodox 27 Christians in Indiana and throughout the United States; and 28 29 Whereas, In November 2006, the archors of the Ecumenical Patriarchate of the order of St. Andrew the 30

Apostle, a group of laymen, each of whom has been honored

with a patriarchal title, or "offikion", by the ecumenical patriarch for their outstanding service to the Orthodox

Church, sent an American delegation to Turkey to meet with
