2	of Representatives and the United States Senate to immediately
3	vote to repeal the medical device excise tax.
4	Whereas, Indiana is home to more than 1,687 companies
5	dedicated to the life science industry, and a significant
6	proportion of those firms are medical device manufacturers;
7	Whereas, Indiana employs in excess of 56,198 workers in the
8	medical technology industry and exports more than \$10 billion
9	in products annually, the second highest value of exports by
10	state in the United States;
11	Whereas, The life science industry accounts for 28 percent
12	of Indiana's total manufacturing exports;

1 Whereas, Improvements in minimally invasive medical technologies have led to significant advances in the health of 2 3 patients and have made it easier to diagnose and treat patients' problems; 4 Whereas, The medical device industry is one of the few U.S. 5 industries that enjoys a net trade surplus, exporting more than 6 7 the U.S. imports. The United States is the only net exporter of medical devices in the world, and the United States medical 8 9 technology industry generates a \$5.4 billion trade surplus; 10 Whereas, The United States Congress passed a 2.3 percent excise tax on the sale price of the taxable medical devices, 11 which took effect on January 1, 2013; 12 Whereas, Employment in the United States medical device 13 14 industry has declined by nearly 29,000 jobs since the enactment of the medical device tax, according to the United States 15 Department of Commerce; 16 17 Whereas, On December 18, 2015, Congress passed the 18 Consolidated Appropriations Act, which included a two year moratorium on the medical device excise tax; and 19 Whereas, Without a full repeal of the medical device excise 20 tax, there will be a substantial decline in research and 21 development for minimally invasive, life-saving cures and 22 treatment, an increase in patient suffering and mortality, and 23 an exodus of jobs to low-tax nations: Therefore, 24 25 *Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the* 26 General Assembly of the State of Indiana: 27 SECTION 1. That the Indiana House of Representatives urges the United States House of Representatives and the United States Senate 28 29 to immediately repeal in its entirety the medical device excise tax. SECTION 2. That the Principal Clerk of the House of 30 Representatives transmit a copy of this resolution to Paul Ryan, 31 32 Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, and each member of the Indiana congressional delegation. 33
