DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Synopsis: Local regulation of fireworks. Provides that a county or municipality may adopt an ordinance to limit or prohibit the days and hours when consumer fireworks or certain other fireworks may be used, ignited, or discharged within the county or municipality, with certain exceptions.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning labor and safety.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

3	JULY 1, 2017]: Sec. 10.5. (a) As used in this section, the term "use'
4	means the ability of a county or municipality to regulate the days and
5	hours when consumer fireworks or items referenced in section 8(a)
6	of this chapter, or both, may be used, ignited, or discharged.
7	(b) Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter:
8	(1) a county may adopt an ordinance concerning the use of
9	consumer fireworks or items referenced in section 8(a) of this
0	chapter, or both, in the unincorporated areas of the county; and
1	(2) a municipality may adopt an ordinance concerning the use of
2	consumer fireworks or items referenced in section 8(a) of this
3	chapter, or both, within the corporate limits of the municipality.
4	(c) An ordinance adopted under this section:
5	(1) may limit or prohibit the use of consumer fireworks or items
6	referenced in section 8(a) of this chapter, or both, in the county
7	or municipality;



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1	(2) may not be more lenient than a rule adopted by a state agency
2	concerning the use of fireworks; and
3	(3) (2) may not limit the use of consumer fireworks or items
4	referenced in section 8(a) of this chapter, or both:
5	(A) between the hours of 5:00 p.m. and two (2) hours after
6	sunset on June 29, June 30, July 1, July 2, July 3 and July 5;
7	July 6, July 7, July 8, and July 9;
8	(B) between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 12:00 midnight on
9	July 4; and
10	(C) between the hours of 10:00 a.m. on December 31 and 1:00
11	a.m. on January 1.
