14	(1) voluntarily; or
15	(2) because of a legal obligation.

2	(c) A person having the care of a child less than six (6) years of
3	age may not leave the child unsupervised in a motor vehicle.
4	(d) It is a defense to an action under this section that the:
5	(1) motor vehicle was located at the person's residence; and
6	(2) engine of the motor vehicle was off.
7	(e) A person who violates this section commits a Class C
8	infraction
