## **SENATE BILL No. 18**

### DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

**Citations Affected:** IC 7.1-3-27; IC 7.1-5-9.

**Synopsis:** Artisan distiller permits. Allows an artisan distiller to produce, in a calendar year, a maximum of 30,000 gallons of liquor not sold through a wholesaler. (Current law allows an artisan distiller to produce, in a calendar year, a maximum of 10,000 gallons of liquor not sold through a wholesaler.) Allows the holder of an artisan distiller's permit to hold a farm winery permit, a microbrewery permit, and a distiller's permit. (Current law allows a holder of an artisan distiller's permit to hold only one of these permits.) Amends permit requirements for certain artisan distillers. Allows the holder of an artisan distiller's permit to: (1) sell liquor for carryout on Sunday; and (2) upon approval, conduct business at three additional locations that are separate from the premises on which the artisan distiller manufactures liquor.

Effective: July 1, 2014.

## SENATE BILL No. 18

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning alcohol and tobacco.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. IC /.1-3-2/-3, AS ADDED BY P.L.109-2013
SECTION 6, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
JULY 1, 2014]: Sec. 3. An artisan distiller may produce not more than
ten thirty thousand (10,000) (30,000) gallons of liquor in any calendar
year. Liquor produced by an artisan distiller that is sold through a
wholesaler licensed under IC 7.1-3-8 may not be counted toward the
gallonage limit.
SECTION 2. IC 7.1-3-27-5, AS ADDED BY P.L.109-2013
SECTION 6, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
JULY 1, 2014]: Sec. 5. (a) Except as provided in section 7 of this
chapter, an applicant for an artisan distiller's permit must meet all the
following requirements to be eligible for an artisan distiller's permit:
(1) The permit applicant must hold at least one (1) of the
following permits for the three (3) year period immediately
preceding the date of the application:
(A) A farm winery permit under IC 7.1-3-12.



1	(B) A brewer's permit for a brewery described in
2	IC 7.1-3-2-7(5).
3 4	(C) A distiller's permit under IC 7.1-3-7.
5	(2) The permit applicant may not have more than one (1) violation of this title during the three (3) year period immediately preceding

7	(3) The permit applicant may not have any violation of this title

9	date of the permit application.
0	(b) As used in this subsection, "qualifying permit" means a farm
1	winery, brewer's, or distiller's permit under subsection $(a)(1)(A)$ ,
12	(a)(1)(B), or (a)(1)(C) that is required in order to hold an artisan
13	distiller's permit. The same persons must directly or indirectly own and
14	control one hundred percent (100%) of the entity that holds the
15	qualifying permit and the artisan distiller's permit.
16	SECTION 3. IC 7.1-3-27-6, AS ADDED BY P.L.109-2013,
17	SECTION 6, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
18	JULY 1, 2014]: Sec. 6. A holder of an artisan distiller's permit may also
19	hold one (1) <b>or more</b> of the following:
20	(1) A farm winery permit.
21	(2) A brewer's permit for a brewery described in IC 7.1-3-2-7(5).
22	(3) A distiller's permit under IC 7.1-3-7.
22 23	SECTION 4. IC 7.1-3-27-7, AS ADDED BY P.L.109-2013,
24	SECTION 6, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
25	JULY 1, 2014]: Sec. 7. (a) This section applies only to a person that, on
26	January 1, 2014:
27	(1) holds the necessary permit or license from the United States
28	to own or operate an establishment to manufacture liquor; and
29	(2) does not hold any of the permits listed in section 5(a)(1) of
30	this chapter.
31	(b) A person must meet all the following requirements to be eligible
32	for an artisan distiller's permit under this section:
33	(1) Any person (except for a person under subdivision (2)) who
34	sells or furnishes liquor by the bottle or glass for consumption on
35	the premises of the artisan distillery:
36	(A) must have held for at least three (3) years an employee a
37	permit under IC 7.1-3-18-9 that authorizes the person to
38	perform bartending duties;

12	(C) may not have any violations under this title.



1	(2) The applicant for the artisan distiller's permit and any
2	management representative of the applicant must complete an
3	alcohol server program or a trainer program established or
4	approved under IC 7.1-3-1.5-5.5 or IC 7.1-3-1.5-6 not more than
5	one (1) year before the date of the application for the artisan
6	distiller's permit.
7	(c) Except as provided in subsection (f)(2), the person may not be
8	required to fulfill the requirements of section 5 of this chapter.
9	(d) If the person is issued an artisan distiller's permit under this
10	section, the person must meet the following requirements for the period
11	set forth in subsection (e):
12	(1) Any person selling or furnishing liquor for consumption on
13	the premises of the artisan distillery (except for a person under
14	subsection (b)(2)) must meet the requirements of subsection
15	(b)(1).
16	(2) The holder of the artisan distiller's permit and any
17	management representative of the holder of the artisan distiller's
18	permit must successfully complete refresher courses under
19	IC 7.1-3-1.5 not later than three (3) years after the date the holder
20	or representative completes the initial server program or trainer
21	program.
22	(e) A person who is issued an artisan distiller's permit under this
23	section must meet the requirements in subsection (d) until the later of:
24	(1) three (3) years after the date on which the initial artisan
25	distiller's permit is issued; or
26	(2) the date that the holder of the artisan distiller's permit has one
27	(1) twelve (12) month period without a violation of this title.
28	(f) Upon fulfilling the requirements of subsections (d) and (e), a
29	person who is issued an artisan distiller's permit under this section must
30	meet the following requirements for as long as the person holds the
31	permit:
32	(1) Any person who sells or furnishes liquor <b>for consumption</b> on
33	the premises of the artisan distillery (except for a person under
34	subsection $(b)(2)$ must have an employee permit under
35	IC 7.1-3-18-9 and be otherwise authorized by the commission to
36	perform bartending duties. However, the person is not required to
37	(A) hold an employee bartending permit for three (3) years
38	before selling or furnishing liquor; and
39	(B) not have any violations under this title.
40	(2) The holder of the artisan distiller's permit and any
41	management representative of the holder of the artisan distiller's
42	permit are subject to the same alcohol server training



1	requirements and refresher course requirements as the holder of
2	an artisan distiller's permit that meets the requirements of section
3	5 of this chapter.
4	SECTION 5. IC 7.1-3-27-8, AS ADDED BY P.L.109-2013,
5	SECTION 6, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
6	JULY 1, 2014]: Sec. 8. (a) The holder of an artisan distiller's permit
7	may do only the following:
8	(1) Manufacture liquor, including blending liquor purchased from
9	another manufacturer with liquor the artisan distiller
10	manufactures under section 11 of this chapter.
11	(2) Bottle liquor manufactured by the artisan distiller.
12	(3) Store liquor manufactured by the artisan distiller.
13	(4) Transport, sell, and deliver liquor manufactured by the artisan
14	distiller to:
15	(A) places outside Indiana; or
16	(B) the holder of a liquor wholesaler's permit under IC 7.1-3-8.
17	(5) Sell liquor manufactured by the artisan distiller to consumers
18	by the drink, bottle, or case from the premises of the distillery
19	where the liquor was manufactured.
20	(6) Serve complimentary samples of the liquor manufactured by
21	the artisan distiller to consumers on the premises of the distillery
22	where the liquor was manufactured.
23	(7) Sell liquor as authorized by this section for carryout on
24	Sunday.
25	(b) The holder of an artisan distiller's permit who provides samples
26	or sells liquor by the glass must furnish the minimum food
27	requirements prescribed by the commission.
28	(c) With the approval of the commission, a holder of an artisan
29	distiller's permit under this chapter may conduct business at not
30	more than three (3) additional locations that are separate from the
31	premises on which the artisan distiller manufactures liquor. At the
32	additional locations, the holder of a permit may conduct any
33	business that is authorized at the first location, except for the
34	manufacturing, including blending, or bottling of liquor.
35	SECTION 6. IC 7.1-5-9-7, AS AMENDED BY P.L.109-2013,
36	SECTION 11, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
37	JULY 1, 2014]: Sec. 7. Except as provided in IC 7.1-3-27-6, it is
38	unlawful for the holder of an artisan distiller's, a distiller's, or a
39	rectifier's permit to own, acquire, possess or cause to be transferred to
40	the holder shares of stock of a corporation that holds an Indiana permit
41	to sell alcoholic beverages at retail, or in a permit to sell at retail in this

to sell alcoholic beverages at retail, or in a permit to sell at retail in this

state, or to own or acquire an interest in the business being conducted



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under the permit, or in or to shares of stock in a corporation that owns
a permit to sell at retail.
SECTION 7. IC 7.1-5-9-8, AS AMENDED BY P.L.109-2013,

SECTION 7. IC 7.1-5-9-8, AS AMENDED BY P.L.109-2013, SECTION 12, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2014]: Sec. 8. The holder of an artisan distiller's permit, a distiller's permit, or a rectifier's permit may not own, acquire, or possess a permit to sell liquor at wholesale. **Except as provided in IC 7.1-3-27-6**, a distiller or rectifier may not have an interest in the business of a permittee who is authorized to sell beer, liquor, or wine at wholesale or retail.
