

SENATE BILL No. 21

DIGEST OF SB 21 (Updated January 8, 2020 1:26 pm - DI 104)

Citations Affected: IC 25-26.

Synopsis: Prescriptions by out-of-state physician assistants. Provides that a pharmacist has a duty to honor all prescriptions issued by: (1) an advanced practice registered nurse; or (2) a physician assistant; licensed under the laws of another state.

Effective: Upon passage.

January 6, 2020, read first time and referred to Committee on Health and Provider Services.

January 9, 2020, amended, reported favorably — Do Pass.

SENATE BILL No. 21

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning professions and occupations.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

- (b) A pharmacist has a duty to honor all prescriptions from a practitioner or from a physician, advanced practice registered nurse, physician assistant, podiatrist, dentist, or veterinarian licensed under the laws of another state. Before honoring a prescription, the pharmacist shall take reasonable steps to determine whether the prescription has been issued in compliance with the laws of the state where it originated. The pharmacist is immune from criminal prosecution or civil liability if he, the pharmacist, in good faith, refuses to honor a prescription because, in his the pharmacist's professional judgment, the honoring of the prescription would:
 - (1) be contrary to law;
 - (2) be against the best interest of the patient;



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1	(3) aid or abet an addiction or habit; or
2	(4) be contrary to the health and safety of the patient
3	SECTION 2. An emergency is declared for this act
