DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: Noncode.

Synopsis: Sheriff reimbursement rate. Provides that the per diem rate paid from the county jail maintenance contingency fund or any other fund after June 30, 2021, and before July 1, 2023, may not be less than \$55 per day for persons convicted of felonies, including: (1) persons convicted of a Level 6 felony; and (2) convicted felons who are incarcerated for more than five days after the day of sentencing or the date upon which the department of correction receives the abstract of judgment and sentencing order, whichever occurs later.

Effective: July 1, 2021.

A BILL FOR AN ACT concerning corrections.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2021] (a) Notwithstanding
2	any budget bill (as defined in IC 4-12-1-2) or any other law enacted
3	by the 2021 regular session of the Indiana general assembly, the
4	per diem rate that is paid from the county jail maintenance
5	contingency fund or any other fund after June 30, 2021, and before
6	July 1, 2023, for the purpose of reimbursing sheriffs for the cost of
7	incarcerating in county jails persons convicted of felonies,
8	including:
9	(1) persons described in IC 35-38-3-3(d); and
10	(2) convicted felons who are incarcerated for more than five
11	(5) days after the day of sentencing or the date upon which the
12	department of correction receives the abstract of judgment
13	and sentencing order, whichever occurs later;
14	may not be less than fifty-five dollars (\$55) per day.
15	(b) This SECTION expires June 30, 2023.
