Synopsis: OWI and public safety officials. Makes operating while intoxicated a Level 6 felony if the operator causes bodily injury to a public safety official or property damage to an authorized emergency vehicle.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning criminal law and procedure.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 9-30-5-3, AS AMENDED BY P.L.158-2013.
2	SECTION 159, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS
3	[EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2019]: Sec. 3. (a) Except as provided in
4	subsection (b), a person who violates section 1 or 2 of this chapter
5	commits a Level 6 felony if:
6	(1) the person has a previous conviction of operating while
7	intoxicated that occurred within the five (5) years immediately
8	preceding the occurrence of the violation of section 1 or 2 of this
9	chapter; or
0	(2) the person:
1	(A) is at least twenty-one (21) years of age;
2	(B) violates section 1(b) or 2(b) of this chapter; and
3	(C) operated a vehicle in which at least one (1) passenger was
4	less than eighteen (18) years of age; or
5	(3) the person causes:
6	(A) bodily injury to a public safety official (as defined in
7	IC 35-42-2-1) who is on duty; or



1	(B) property damage to an authorized emergency vehicle

2	being used by a public safety official while on duty, even if
3	the vehicle is not occupied by the public safety official at
4	the time the property damage occurs.
5	(b) A person who violates section 1 or 2 of this chapter or
6	subsection (a)(2) commits a Level 5 felony if:
7	(1) the person has a previous conviction of operating while
8	intoxicated causing death (IC 9-30-5-5); or
9	(2) the person has a previous conviction of operating while
10	intoxicated causing serious bodily injury (IC 9-30-5-4).
