DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 12-17.2-3.5-8.

**Synopsis:** Child care education and training. Specifies training requirements that must be met by a child care provider as a condition of eligibility to receive a federal Child Care and Development Fund voucher payment.

Effective: July 1, 2014.

### **SENATE BILL No. 26**

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning human services.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. IC 12-17.2-3.5-8, AS AMENDED BY P.L.225-2013,
 SECTION 13, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
 JULY 1, 2014]: Sec. 8. (a) At least one (1) adult individual who
 maintains annual certification in a course of cardiopulmonary
 resuscitation applicable to all age groups of children cared for by a
 provider shall be present at all times when a child is in the care of the
 provider.

(b) The following apply to an individual who is employed or volunteers as a caregiver at a facility where a provider operates a child care program:

(1) The individual shall maintain current certification in first aid
applicable to all age groups of children cared for by the provider.
(2) If the individual is:
(A) at least eighteen (18) upons of age, the individual mouset

14(A) at least eighteen (18) years of age, the individual may act15as a caregiver without supervision of another caregiver; or16(B) less than eighteen (18) years of age, the individual may act
