## SENATE BILL No. 29

### DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

**Citations Affected:** IC 12-17.2-7.2-7.2.

**Synopsis:** Prekindergarten pilot program eligibility. Removes the requirement that, for an eligible child to qualify for a grant under the prekindergarten pilot program, the eligible child reside with a parent or guardian who is: (1) working or attending a job training program or educational program; or (2) actively seeking employment. Removes a provision that allows priority for a grant to an eligible child whose parent or guardian is involved in: (1) activities that improve the parent's or guardian's education; or (2) job training.

Effective: July 1, 2018.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

4	(1) The eligible child will attend the prekindergarten program of
5	an eligible provider selected by the parent or guardian for the full
6	duration of the prekindergarten program year.
7	(2) The parent or guardian will not transfer to another

1	prekindergarten program during the prekindergarten program

3	(3) The eligible child will attend the prekindergarten program at
4	least eighty-five percent (85%) of the days that the
5	prekindergarten program is provided.
6	(4) The parent or guardian will allow the eligible child to
7	participate in an external evaluation conducted by researchers,
8	including the kindergarten readiness assessment and measuring
9	of developmental and academic progress.
10	(5) The parent or guardian will participate in family engagement
l 1	and involvement activities offered by the selected prekindergarten
12	program, including meetings with the eligible child's teacher to
13	discuss the eligible child's progress or any other conference
14	concerning the eligible child that is requested by the eligible

16	(6) The parent or guardian will complete the necessary forms for
17	the eligible child to receive a student test number from the
18	department of education.
19	(7) The parent or guardian will send the eligible child to
20	kindergarten.
21	(8) The parent or guardian will read to the eligible child each
22	week.
23	(9) Any other condition the office determines is appropriate.
24	(c) Priority may be given to an eligible child under this section if a
25	parent or guardian of the eligible child is:
26	(1) involved in activities that improve the parent's or guardian's
27	education; or
28	(2) involved in job training.
