DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 25-23.6-11-4.

Synopsis: Prohibition of conversion therapy. Prohibits a mental health provider from engaging in conversion therapy with a patient less than 18 years of age, and subjects a mental health provider who violates the prohibition to disciplinary action.

SENATE BILL No. 32

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning professions and occupations.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1 SECTION 1. IC 25-23.6-11-4 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA 2 CODE AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS 3 [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2021]: Sec. 4. (a) As used in this section, 4 "conversion therapy" means any practice or treatment that seeks 5 to change an individual's sexual orientation or gender identity, 6 including any effort to change gender expression or to eliminate or 7 reduce sexual or romantic attraction or feelings toward individuals 8 of the same gender. The term does not include counseling intended 9 to assist a person undergoing gender transition, provide 10 acceptance, support, and understanding to a person, or facilitate 11 the individual's coping, social support, or identity exploration and 12 development as long as the counseling does not seek to change the 13 individual's sexual orientation or gender identity.

14 (b) As used in this section, "mental health provider" includes15 the following:

(1) A psychiatrist or physician who is licensed under IC 25-22.5.
