DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 5-4-1.

Synopsis: Public official bonding. Provides that if an incoming elective officer is not permitted to take office because the incoming officer is unable to give an official bond, the incumbent officer is entitled to hold over as provided in the Constitution of the State of Indiana. Provides that if the incumbent officer refuses to hold over or otherwise vacates the office, the vacancy shall be filled as provided by law. Provides that if the incoming officer is able to give the official bond not later than 30 days after the beginning of the term of office to which the incoming officer was elected, the incoming officer is entitled to take office upon giving the official bond.

Effective: July 1, 2014.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

(e) An incoming officer who is unable to give an official bond as required in section 9 of this chapter is entitled to take the office upon giving the official bond if the incoming officer gives the official bond not later than thirty (30) days after the beginning of the term of office to which the incoming officer was elected.
