DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 20-30.

Synopsis: School curriculum. Requires each school corporation, charter school, and state accredited nonpublic elementary school to include cursive writing in its curriculum.

Effective: July 1, 2021.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:
