

SENATE BILL No. 56

DIGEST OF SB 56 (Updated January 31, 2023 11:40 am - DI 140)

Citations Affected: IC 21-13.

Synopsis: Armed forces reservist tuition supplement program fund. Establishes the armed forces reservist tuition supplement program fund (fund). Provides that the fund shall be used to provide annual scholarships to members of a reserve component of the armed forces of the United States, not including the Army or Air National Guard, under certain conditions. Provides that scholarships issued under the fund may be renewed under certain criteria.

Effective: July 1, 2023.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning higher education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 21-13-1-4, AS AMENDED BY P.L.63-2021
2	SECTION 4, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3	JULY 1, 2023]: Sec. 4. (a) "Eligible student", for purposes of section

twelve (12) months immediately preceding the date the person
applies for a tuition scholarship under this chapter;
(2) possesses the requisite academic qualifications;
(3) meets the requirements of the state educational institution
in which the person is enrolled or will enroll; and
(4) meets all other eligibility requirements as determined by
the commission.
SECTION 2. IC 21-13-1-5, AS AMENDED BY P.L.148-2016,
SECTION 1, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
JULY 1, 2023]: Sec. 5. "Fund":
(1) for purposes of IC 21-13-2, refers to the William A. Crawford
minority teacher scholarship fund established by IC 21-13-2-1;
(2) for purposes of IC 21-13-4, refers to the National Guard
tuition supplement program fund established by IC 21-13-4-1;
(3) for purposes of IC 21-13-4.5, refers to the armed forces
reservist tuition supplement program fund established by
IC 21-13-4.5-1;
(3) (4) for purposes of IC 21-13-5, refers to the National Guard
scholarship extension fund established by IC 21-13-5-1;
(4) (5) for purposes of IC 21-13-6, refers to the primary care
physician loan forgiveness fund established by IC 21-13-6-3; and
(5) (6) for purposes of IC 21-13-6.5, refers to the medical
residency education fund established by IC 21-13-6.5-1.
SECTION 3. IC 21-13-1-8, AS AMENDED BY P.L.217-2015,
SECTION 2, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
JULY 1, 2023]: Sec. 8. (a) "Scholarship applicant", for purposes of
IC 21-13-4, means a person who:
(1) is an eligible student;
(2) has been accepted to attend a state educational institution as
a full-time or part-time student;
(3) has been certified to have met all National Guard
requirements; and
(4) according to commission requirements, has timely filed an
application for and, if applicable, used any federal and state
financial assistance available to the person to attend a state
educational institution.
(b) "Scholarship applicant", for purposes of IC 21-13-4.5,
means a person who:
(1) is an eligible student;



1	(2) has been accepted to attend a state educational institution
2	as a full-time or part-time student;
3	(3) is a member of a reserve component of the armed forces o
4	the United States, not including the Army or Air Nationa
5	Guard, who is in active drill status, as prescribed by the
6	commission; and

14	Chapter 4.5. Armed Forces Reservist Tuition Supplemen
15	Program
16	Sec. 1. (a) The armed forces reservist tuition supplemen
17	program fund is established to provide the financial resource
18	necessary to award the tuition scholarships authorized under the
19	program.
20	(b) The commission shall administer the fund.
21	(c) The fund consists of the following:
22	(1) Money appropriated to the fund by the general assembly
23	(2) Donations, gifts, and money received from any other
24	source, including transfers from other funds or accounts.
25	(d) The expenses of administering the fund shall be paid from
26	money in the fund.
27	(e) Money in the fund at the end of a state fiscal year does no
28	revert to the state general fund but remains available to be used for
29	providing money for reservist tuition supplement scholarship
30	under this chapter.
31	Sec. 2. Money in the armed forces reservist tuition supplemen
32	program fund shall be used to provide annual scholarships to
33	scholarship applicants in an amount that is equal to one (1) of the
34	following amounts:
35	(1) If the scholarship applicant does not receive other
36	financial assistance specifically designated for educationa
37	costs, the amount equal to a full undergraduate tuition
38	scholarship to attend the state educational institution.
39	(2) If the scholarship applicant receives other financia
40	assistance specifically designated for educational costs, the
41	amount:

(A) equal to the balance required to attend the state

1	educational institution; and
2	(B) not to exceed the amount described in subdivision (1).
3	Sec. 3. A scholarship awarded to an applicant under section 2 of
4	this chapter shall be reduced based upon the number of college
5	credits awarded to the applicant as a result of the applicant's
6	completion of College Level Examination Prep (CLEP) programs
7	prior to entering an undergraduate degree program.
8	Sec. 4. (a) Subject to subsection (b), each scholarship awarded
9	under this chapter:
10	(1) may be renewed under this chapter for a total scholarship
11	award that does not exceed the equivalent of the number of
12	terms that constitutes four (4) academic years as determined
13	by the commission; and
14	(2) is subject to other eligibility criteria as established by the
15	commission.
16	(b) A scholarship awarded under this chapter may not be
17	renewed if the eligible individual fails to maintain at least a
18	cumulative grade point average that the eligible institution
19	determines is satisfactory academic progress.
