Synopsis: Graduation rate calculation. Changes the definition of "cohort" for purposes of calculating a high school's graduation rate.

Effective: July 1, 2017.

SENATE BILL No. 57

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1 SECTION 1. IC 20-26-13-2, AS AMENDED BY P.L.229-2007,
2 SECTION 3, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3 JULY 1, 2017]: Sec. 2. **(a) Except as provided in subsection (b)**, as
4 used in this chapter, "cohort" refers to a class of students who:
5 (1) attend the same high school; and
6 (2) are first considered to have entered grade 9 in the same year.
7 **(b) The term does not include an individual entering grade 9**
8 **who is:**
9 (1) **pursuing a certificate of completion under an**
10 **individualized education program established under IC 20-35;**
11 **and**
12 (2) **ineligible to graduate as determined by a case conference**
13 **committee.**
