DIGEST OF SB 57 (Updated January 15, 2014 10:48 am - DI 84)

Citations Affected: IC 10-16.

Synopsis: Military personnel jury service exemptions. Exempts individuals who serve in a reserve component of the armed forces of the United States from jury duty in any court of Indiana. (The introduced version of this bill was prepared by the commission on military and veterans affairs.)

Effective: July 1, 2014.

SENATE BILL No. 57

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning military and veterans.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 10-16-16-1, AS AMENDED BY P.L.151-2007,
2	SECTION 1, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3	JULY 1, 2014]: Sec. 1. An individual:
4	(1) who serves on active duty in the armed forces of the United
5	States or the Indiana National Guard; or
6	(2) who:
7	(A) serves in a reserve component of the armed forces of
8	the United States; and
9	(B) is on orders;
10	is exempt from service on any jury in any court of Indiana.
