DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 16-27-1-16.

Synopsis: Written orders for home health services. Adds advanced practice registered nurses, clinical nurse specialists, and physician assistants as providers who may make written orders for home health services for use by licensed home health agencies.

Effective: July 1, 2021.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning health.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 16-27-1-16 IS AMENDED TO READ AS
2	FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2021]: Sec. 16. (a) A licensed home
3	health agency may accept written orders for home health services from
4	(1) a physician;
5	(2) an advanced practice registered nurse, including a clinical
6	nurse specialist;
7	(3) a physician assistant;
8	(4) a dentist;
9	(5) a chiropractor;
0	(6) a podiatrist; or
1	(7) an optometrist;
2	licensed in Indiana or any other state.
3	(b) If the physician, advanced practice registered nurse, clinical
4	nurse specialist, physician assistant, dentist, chiropractor, podiatrist
5	or optometrist is licensed in a state other than Indiana, the home health
6	agency shall take reasonable immediate steps to determine that:
7	(1) the order complies with the laws of the state where the order



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originated; and
(2) the individual who issued the order examined the patient and
is licensed to practice in that state.
(b) (c) All orders issued by a physician, an advanced practice
registered nurse, a clinical nurse specialist, a physician assistant,
a dentist, a chiropractor, a podiatrist, or an optometrist for home health
services:
(1) must meet the same requirements whether the order originates
in Indiana or another state; and
(2) from another state may not exceed the authority allowed under
orders from the same profession in Indiana under IC 25.
