## SENATE BILL No. 76

## DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 35-42-3.5.

**Synopsis:** Human trafficking. Provides that money or property paid in human trafficking may be paid to a human trafficking victim or a third party. Increases the penalty if the human trafficking victim is less than 18 years of age, and specifies that: (1) consent by the human trafficking victim; (2) a belief that the human trafficking victim was at least 18 years of age; or (3) the intended victim is a law enforcement officer; is not a defense to a prosecution.

Effective: July 1, 2021.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning criminal law and procedure.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

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1	(4) knowingly destroying, concealing, removing, confiscating, or
2	possessing any actual or purported passport or other immigration
3	document, or any other actual or purported government

5	(5) using blackmail or threatening to cause financial harm for the
6	purpose of exercising financial control over the human trafficking
7	victim; or
8	(6) facilitating or controlling a human trafficking victim's access
9	to a controlled substance.

11	SECTION 24, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
12	JULY 1, 2021]: Sec. 1.4. (a) A person who knowingly or intentionally:
13	(1) pays, to, or offers or agrees to pay, to, agrees to pay money or
14	other property; <b>or</b>
15	(2) to, or benefits in some other manner another person offers a
16	benefit;
17	to for a human trafficking victim or a third party for an act performed
18	by a human trafficking victim commits human trafficking, a Level 5
19	felony. However, the offense is a Level 4 felony if the human
20	trafficking victim is less than eighteen (18) years of age.
21	(b) It is not a defense to a prosecution under this section that:
22	(1) the human trafficking victim consented;
23	(2) the person believed the human trafficking victim to be at
24	least eighteen (18) years of age; or
25	(3) the intended victim of the offense is a law enforcement
26	officer.
