

### SENATE BILL No. 79

DIGEST OF SB 79 (Updated January 13, 2022 11:50 am - DI 129)

Citations Affected: IC 36-8.

**Synopsis:** 1977 pension and disability fund. Establishes the 1977 fund defined contribution plan (plan). Provides that current employees may make contributions to the plan. Specifies rules and requirements for the plan concerning items that include member elections, member contributions, vesting, rollover distributions, and withdrawal of funds. (The introduced version of this bill was prepared by the interim study committee on pension management oversight.)

Effective: July 1, 2022.

## **SENATE BILL No. 79**

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning pensions.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 36-8-8.1 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
2	AS A <b>NEW</b> CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3	JULY 1, 2022]:
4	Chapter 8.1. 1977 Fund Defined Contribution Plan
5	Sec. 1. This chapter applies after the effective date of the plan to
6	an individual who:
7	(1) is currently employed by an employer;
8	(2) is a member of the 1977 fund; and
9	(3) makes an election described in section 6 of this chapter to
0	become a member of the plan.
1	Sec. 2. The following definitions apply throughout this chapter:
2	(1) "1977 fund" has the meaning set forth in IC 36-8-1-5.
3	(2) "Account" means the plan account established for a
4	member under section 7(b) of this chapter.
5	(3) "Effective date" means the first day of the month that is
6	six (6) months after the month in which the system board
7	adopts provisions to implement the plan under section 4(b) of



1	this chapter.
2	(4) "Employer" has the meaning set forth in IC 36-8-8-2.
3	(5) "Internal Revenue Code" has the meaning set forth in
4	IC 36-8-2.5(a).
5	(6) "Member" means an individual described in section 1 of
6	this chapter who is not otherwise excluded from membership
7	in the plan.
8	(7) "Normal retirement age" for a member means the
9	member is at least fifty-two (52) years of age.
10	(8) "Plan" refers to the 1977 fund defined contribution plan
11	established by section 4 of this chapter.
12	(9) "System board" refers to the board of trustees of the
13	Indiana public retirement system established by IC 5-10.5-3-1.
14	(10) "Years of participation" means all periods of
15	participation in the plan in a covered position, plus any
16	additional service for which this chapter provides years of
17	participation credit.
18	Sec. 3. Except as otherwise provided in this chapter or by
19	federal law, and subject to the system board obtaining any
20	approval from the Internal Revenue Service that the system board
21	considers necessary or desirable, the provisions of this article that
22	apply to the 1977 fund apply to an account established under this
23 24	chapter.
24	Sec. 4. (a) The 1977 fund defined contribution plan is established
25	for the purpose of providing amounts funded by a member for the
26	use of the member or the member's beneficiaries or survivors after
27	the member's retirement.
28	(b) The system board shall adopt provisions to implement the
29	plan established under subsection (a). Subject to the system board
30	obtaining any approval from the Internal Revenue Service that the
31	system board considers necessary or desirable, the system board
32	shall offer the plan as a separate fund under Section 401(a) or
33	another applicable section of the Internal Revenue Code.
34	(c) The system board shall administer the plan.
35	(d) The system board may adopt a plan document that it
36	considers appropriate or necessary to administer the plan.
37	Sec. 5. The system board may request from the Internal
38	Revenue Service any rulings or determination letters that the
39	system board considers necessary or appropriate in order to
40	implement or administer the plan.

Sec. 6. (a) An individual who, on or after the effective date of the

plan, meets the qualifications under section 1(1) through 1(2) of



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1	this chapter may elect to become a member of the plan.
2	(b) An election under this section:
3	(1) must be made in writing; and
4	(2) must be filed with the system board, on a form prescribed
5	by the system board.
6	Sec. 7. (a) The plan consists of the following:
7	(1) Each member's contributions to the plan under section 9
8	of this chapter.
9	(2) Rollovers to the plan by a member under section 14 of this
10	chapter.
11	(3) All earnings on investments or deposits of the plan.
12	(4) All contributions or payments to the plan made in the
13	manner provided by the general assembly.
14	(b) The plan shall establish an account for each member. A
15	member's account consists of:
16	(1) the member's contributions to the plan under section 9 of
17	this chapter; and
18	(2) the net earnings on the contributions described in
19	subdivision (1) as determined under section 8 of this chapter.
20	(c) If a member makes rollover contributions under section 14
21	of this chapter, the plan shall establish a rollover account as a
22	separate subaccount within the member's account.
23	Sec. 8. (a) Subject to the system board obtaining any approval
24	from the Internal Revenue Service that the system board considers
25	necessary or desirable, the system board shall establish:
26	(1) a stable value fund for the plan; and
27	(2) alternative investment programs for the plan.
28	(b) The system board may adopt requirements and rules that
29	apply to the alternative investment programs within the plan,
30	including the following:
31	(1) The system board's investment guidelines and limits for
32	the alternative investment programs.
33	(2) A member's selection of and changes to the member's
34	investment options.
35	(3) The valuation of a member's account.
36	(4) The allocation and payment of administrative expenses for
37	the alternative investment programs.
38	(c) The system board shall determine the appropriate
39	administrative fees to be charged to the member accounts. The fees
10	charged to the member accounts under this subsection shall be

greater in the first year of plan implementation to cover any

administrative costs and may be lowered in subsequent years to



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1	cover ongoing administrative costs of the plan.
2	Sec. 9. (a) Each member may make contributions to the plan.
3	(b) Member contributions must be credited to the member's
4	account.
5	Sec. 10. Member contributions and net earnings on the member
6	contributions in the member account belong to the member at all
7	times and do not belong to the employer. The member is fully
8	vested in the member account.
9	Sec. 11. (a) Subject to the provisions of the Internal Revenue
10	Code applicable to qualified plan distributions, a member who
11	terminates service in a covered position is entitled to withdraw all
12	or part of the amounts in the member's account to the extent the
13	member is vested in the account. A member must make a required
14	withdrawal from the member's account not later than the required
15	beginning date under the Internal Revenue Code.
16	(b) A member may elect to have withdrawals paid as:
17	(1) a lump sum;
18	(2) a direct rollover to another eligible retirement plan; or
19	(3) if the member has attained normal retirement age, a
20	monthly annuity in accordance with the rules of the system
21	board.
22	(c) The system board may establish a minimum account balance
23	or a minimum monthly payment amount in order for a member to
24	select the monthly annuity option. The system board shall establish
25	the forms of annuity by rule, in consultation with the system
26	board's actuary. The system board shall give members information
27	about these forms of payment and any information required by
28	federal law to accompany such distributions.
29	(d) Unless otherwise required by federal law, state law, or this
30	chapter, the requirements and rules that apply to the distribution
31	of the 1977 fund apply to distributions from a member's account.
32	(e) Subject to the Pension Protection Act of 2006 and
33	notwithstanding any state law, an active member who:
34	(1) is at least fifty-nine and one-half (59 1/2) years of age; and
35	(2) has attained vested status in the fund;
36	may withdraw all or part of the amount in the member's account
37	without separating from a covered position.
38	Sec. 12. (a) If a member dies:
39	(1) while in service in a position covered by the plan; or
40	(2) after terminating service in a position covered by the plan
41	but before withdrawing the member's account;
42	to the extent that the member is vested, the member's account shall



be paid to the beneficiary or beneficiaries designated by member on a form prescribed by the system board. The an	,
paid must be valued as provided in IC 5-10.2-2-3(f)	
IC 5-10.2-2-3(h). The system board shall invest the total amou	ınt in
the member's account in the stable value fund not later than t	hirty
(30) days after receiving notification of a member's death.	•

- (b) If there is no properly designated beneficiary, or if no beneficiary survives the member, the member's account shall be paid to:
  - (1) the surviving spouse of the member;
  - (2) if there is not a surviving spouse, the surviving dependent or dependents of the member in equal shares; or
  - (3) if there is not a surviving spouse or dependent, the member's estate.
- (c) The beneficiary or beneficiaries designated under subsection (a) or a survivor determined under subsection (b) may elect to have the member's account paid as:
  - (1) a lump sum;

- (2) a direct rollover to another eligible retirement plan; or
- (3) a monthly annuity in accordance with rules of the system board.

A monthly annuity is an option only on or after the date the beneficiary or survivor becomes sixty-two (62) years of age. The system board shall establish the forms of annuity by rule, in consultation with the system board's actuary. Further, the system board may establish a minimum account balance or a minimum monthly payment amount that is required in order for a beneficiary or survivor to select the monthly annuity option.

- Sec. 13. (a) All assets in the plan are exempt from levy, sale, garnishment, attachment, or other legal process.
- (b) A member, beneficiary, or survivor may not assign any payment under this chapter except for the following:
  - (1) Premiums on a life, hospitalization, surgical, or medical group insurance plan maintained in part by a state agency.
  - (2) Dues to an association that proves to the system board's satisfaction that the association has as members at least twenty percent (20%) of the retired members in the plan.
- Sec. 14. (a) To the extent permitted by the Internal Revenue Code and the applicable regulations and guidance, the plan may accept, on behalf of any member, a rollover distribution from any of the following:
  - (1) A qualified plan described in Section 401(a) or Section



1	403(a) of the Internal Revenue Code.
2	(2) An annuity contract or account described in Section 403(b)
3	of the Internal Revenue Code.
4	(3) An eligible plan maintained by a state, a political
5	subdivision of a state, or an agency or instrumentality of a
6	state or political subdivision of a state under Section 457(b) of
7	the Internal Revenue Code.
8	(4) An individual retirement account or annuity described in
9	Section 408(a) or Section 408(b) of the Internal Revenue
10	Code.
11	(b) Any amounts rolled over under subsection (a) must be
12	accounted for in a rollover account that is separate from the
13	member's account in the plan. The member is fully vested in the
14	member's rollover account.
15	(c) A member may direct the investment of the member's
16	rollover account into any alternative investment option that the
17	system board may make available to the member's rollover
18	account under section 8 of this chapter.
19	(d) A member may withdraw all or part of the member's
20	rollover account from the plan in a lump sum or direct a rollover
21	to an eligible retirement plan at any time. Upon attainment of
22	normal retirement age, in addition to these payment options, the
23	member may withdraw the member's rollover account as a
24	monthly annuity as established by the system board in accordance
25	with the annuity options that are available for the member's
26	account in the plan. A member shall make a required withdrawal
27	from the member's account in the plan not later than the required
28	beginning date under the Internal Revenue Code.
29	Sec. 15. (a) If a member becomes disabled while in a covered
30	position, subject to any federal law limitations concerning qualified
31	plan distributions and the member furnishing to the system board
32	the proof of disability required under state and federal law, to the
33	extent that the member is vested, the member may make a full or
34	partial withdrawal from the member's account.
35	(b) The member may elect to have the withdrawal paid as:
36	(1) a lump sum;
37	(2) a direct rollover to another eligible retirement plan; or
38	(3) a monthly annuity in accordance with the rules of the
39	system board.
40	(c) The system board may establish a minimum account balance
41	or a minimum monthly payment amount in order for a member to



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select the monthly annuity option.

1	Sec. 16. (a) If a member of the plan separates from employment
2	with the member's employer and later returns to employment in a
3	position covered by the plan:
4	(1) the individual resumes membership in the plan; and
5	(2) the member is entitled to receive credit for the member's
6	years of participation in the plan before the member's
7	separation.
8	(b) An individual who elected under section 6 of this chapter to
9	become a member of the plan resumes membership in the plan
10	upon the individual's return to employment covered by the plan.
