DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 7.1-3-26-7.

Synopsis: Direct wine seller's permit. Eliminates the requirement that a person applying for or holding a direct wine seller's permit (excluding an Indiana farm winery) may not distribute wine in Indiana through a wholesaler: (1) within 120 days before the permit application; and (2) during the permit term.

Effective: July 1, 2019.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning alcohol and tobacco.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

2	SECTION 7, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3	JULY 1, 2019]: Sec. 7. (a) The commission may issue a direct wine
4	seller's permit to an applicant who meets all of the following
5	requirements:
6	(1) The applicant is domiciled and has its principal place of
7	business in the United States.
8	(2) The applicant is engaged in the manufacture of wine.
9	(3) The applicant holds and acts within the scope of authority of
0	an alcoholic beverage license or permit to manufacture wine that
1	is required:
2	(A) in Indiana or the state where the applicant is domiciled;
3	and
4	(B) by the Tax and Trade Bureau of the United States
5	Department of the Treasury.
6	(4) The applicant qualifies with the secretary of state to do
7	business in Indiana and consents to the personal jurisdiction of

1	the commission and the courts of Indiana.
2	(5) The applicant:
3	(A) has not distributed wine through a wine wholesaler in
4	Indiana within the one hundred twenty (120) days immediately
5	preceding the applicant's application for a direct wine seller's
6	permit and does not distribute wine through a wine wholesaler
7	in Indiana during the term of the direct wine seller's permit; or
8	(B) has operated as a farm winery under IC 7.1-3-12.
9	(6) (5) The applicant completes documentation regarding the
10	applicant's application required by the commission.
11	(b) The commission may issue a direct wine seller's permit to an
12	applicant who:
13	(1) meets the requirements under subsection (a); and
14	(2) holds a permit issued under this title that allows the sale of an
15	alcoholic beverage at retail.
