# SENATE BILL No. 97

#### DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 36-8.

**Synopsis:** Residency of police officers and firefighters. Allows a city, town, or township to adopt an ordinance or resolution that allows a member of a police or fire department to reside within a county that is: (1) located outside Indiana and contiguous to the county in which the city, town, or township is located; or (2) any Indiana county, if the member resides within 25 miles from the nearest boundary of the city, town, or township where the police or fire department is located.

Effective: July 1, 2018.

## SENATE BILL No. 97

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning local government.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. IC 36-8-4-2, AS AMENDED BY P.L.65-2008,
SECTION 1, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
JULY 1, 2018]: Sec. 2. (a) Except as provided in subsections (b)
through (e), members of the police and fire departments must reside
in Indiana within:
(1) the county in which the city is located; or
(2) a county that is contiguous to the county in which the city is
located.
(b) A city may adopt an ordinance that allows a member of a
police or fire department to reside within:
(1) a county located outside Indiana and contiguous to the
county in which the city is located; or
(2) any Indiana county, if the member resides not more than
twenty-five (25) miles from the nearest boundary of the city
where the police or fire department is located.
(b) (c) In a consolidated city, a member who was residing outside
the county on January 1, 1975, is exempt from subsection (a).

1	(c) (d) A city with a population of less than seven thousand five
2	hundred (7,500) may adopt an ordinance that requires a member of the
3	city's police or fire department to comply with the following:
4	(1) Reside within the county in which the city is located.
5	(2) Have adequate means of transportation into the city.
6	(3) Maintain in the member's residence telephone service with the
7	city.
8	(d) (e) This subsection applies to a city that:
9	(1) has a population of less than seven thousand five hundred

13	A city may require, in addition to the requirements of subsection (c),
14	(d), that a member of the police or fire department reside within the

33	(2) any Indiana county, if the member resides not more than
34	twenty-five (25) miles from the nearest boundary of the town
35	where the police or fire department is located.

37	SECTION 4, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
38	JULY 1, 2018]: Sec. 4. (a) Except as provided in subsection (b), a
39	member of a township fire department must reside in Indiana within:

1	(b) A township may adopt a resolution that allows a member of
2	a fire department to reside within:
3	(1) a county that is located outside Indiana and contiguous to
4	the county in which the township is located; or
5	(2) any Indiana county, if the member resides not more than
6	twenty-five (25) miles from the nearest boundary of the
7	township where the fire department is located.
