Citations Affected: Noncode.

Synopsis: Support for educational needs. Urges the legislative council to study the topic of educational support orders during the 2015 interim.

Effective: July 1, 2015.

A BILL FOR AN ACT concerning family law and juvenile law.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2015] (a) The general
2	assembly urges the legislative council to assign to an appropriate
3	study committee for study during the 2015 interim the topic of the
4	duty to support the educational needs of a child who is at least
5	nineteen (19) years of age.

(b) This SECTION expires November 1, 2015.
