SENATE BILL No. 114

DIGEST OF SB 114 (Updated January 25, 2021 4:27 pm - DI 140)

Citations Affected: IC 12-7; IC 12-15.

Synopsis: Medicaid reimbursement for children's hospitals. Requires the office of the secretary of family and social services to reimburse a children's hospital located in a state bordering Indiana for covered Medicaid services provided to a qualifying Medicaid child recipient at the same reimbursement rate at which the office reimburses a children's hospital located in Indiana.

Effective: July 1, 2021.

SENATE BILL No. 114

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning Medicaid.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 12-7-2-32.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
2	AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
3	1, 2021]: Sec. 32.5. "Children's hospital", for purposes of
4	IC 12-15-15.5, has the meaning set forth in IC 12-15-15.5-1.
5	SECTION 2. IC 12-15-15.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
6	AS A NEW CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
7	JULY 1, 2021]:
8	Chapter 15.5. Out-of-State Children's Hospital Pilot Program
9	Sec. 1. As used in this chapter, "children's hospital" means a
10	freestanding general acute care hospital that:
11	(1) is a level I trauma center or a level IV neonatal care unit,
12	or both; and
13	(2) is either:
14	(A) designated by the Medicare program as a children's
15	hospital; or
16	(B) furnishes services to inpatients who are predominantly
17	individuals less than eighteen (18) years of age, as

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1	determined using the same criteria used by the Medicare
2	program to determine whether a hospital's services are
$\frac{2}{3}$	furnished to inpatients who are predominantly individuals
4	less than eighteen (18) years of age.
5	Sec. 2. This chapter applies to inpatient Medicaid services and
6	outpatient Medicaid services provided at a children's hospital
7	located in a state bordering Indiana.
8	Sec. 3. (a) The office shall reimburse a children's hospital at a
9	rate described in section 4 of this chapter if the Medicaid recipient
10	who received the covered Medicaid services is qualified as set forth
11	in subsection (b).
12	(b) A Medicaid recipient is qualified for purposes of this chapter
13	if the following criteria are met:
14	(1) Either:
15	(A) the Medicaid service is not being offered or is
16	otherwise unavailable in Indiana; or
17	(B) the recipient's provider determines that it is medically
18	necessary for the recipient to obtain the services at a
19	children's hospital located in a state bordering Indiana.
20	(2) The recipient obtained the covered Medicaid service from
21	a children's hospital located in a state bordering Indiana.
22	Sec. 4. The office shall reimburse the children's hospital for the
23	provision of the covered Medicaid service to a qualified recipient
24	at the same reimbursement rate at which the office reimburses a
25	children's hospital located in Indiana for the service.
26	Sec. 5. The office shall apply to the United States Department of
27	Health and Human Services for any state plan amendment or
28	Medicaid waiver necessary to implement and administer this
29	chapter.
30	Sec. 6. The office may adopt rules under IC 4-22-2 necessary for
31	the implementation and administration of this chapter.
