## **ENGROSSED SENATE BILL No. 132**

DIGEST OF SB 132 (Updated March 27, 2019 12:36 pm - DI 116)

Citations Affected: IC 20-30.

**Synopsis:** Civics. Provides that as part of the United States government credit awarded for the general, Core 40, Core 40 with academic honors, and Core 40 with technical honors designation, each high school shall administer the naturalization examination provided by the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services. Requires an enhanced study of the Holocaust in each high school United States history course.

Effective: July 1, 2019.

# ENGROSSED SENATE BILL No. 132

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 20-30-5-7, AS AMENDED BY P.L.132-2018,
2	SECTION 2, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3	JULY 1, 2019]: Sec. 7. (a) Each school corporation shall include in the
4	school corporation's curriculum the following studies:
5	(1) Language arts, including:
6	(A) English;
7	(B) grammar;
8	(C) composition;
9	(D) speech; and
10	(E) second languages.
11	(2) Mathematics.
12	(3) Social studies and citizenship, including the:
13	(A) constitutions;
14	(B) governmental systems; and
15	(C) histories;
16	of Indiana and the United States, including <del>a</del> an enhanced study
17	of the Holocaust in each high school United States history course.
