Synopsis: Juveniles and firearms. Provides that a child who commits dangerous possession of a firearm or provides a firearm to another child in certain circumstances has committed a delinquent act subject to the jurisdiction of a juvenile court.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning family law and juvenile law.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 31-37-1-2 IS AMENDED TO READ AS
2	FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2021]: Sec. 2. A child commits a
3	delinquent act if, before becoming eighteen (18) years of age the child
4	commits an act:
5	(1) that would be an offense if committed by an adult; or
6	(2) described in violation of IC 35-47-10-5;
7	except an act committed by a person over which the juvenile court
8	lacks jurisdiction under IC 31-30-1.
