DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 4-4-35.

Synopsis: Small business council established. Establishes the small business council (council) to provide oversight and guidance to the office of small business and entrepreneurship (office). Designates the membership of the council. Specifies the duties of the council. Requires the office to report to the council and the council to meet at least twice each year to hear the office's reports. Requires the council to submit an annual report to the legislative council. Specifies that the office may not refuse to provide assistance or information to an individual or entity because of the individual's or entity's income or other compensation, credit history, credit score, employment history, or criminal history.

Effective: July 1, 2015.

SENATE BILL No. 141

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning state offices and administration.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. IC 4-4-35-3, AS ADDED BY P.L.187-2014,

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(A) The lieutenant governor.

18	(c) A majority of the entire membership of the council
19	constitutes a quorum. An action of the council is not valid unless
20	approved by at least a majority of the members, including
21	approving the final report.
22	(d) A member of the small business council is not entitled to any
23	per diem for carrying out the duties of the council. However, a
24	member of the small business council is entitled to reimbursement
25	for any traveling expenses as provided under IC 4-13-1-4 and other
26	expenses actually incurred in connection with the member's duties
27	as provided in the state policies and procedures established by the
28	Indiana department of administration and approved by the budget
29	agency.
30	(e) The small business council must meet at least two (2) times
31	each year before September 1. The council shall accept reports and
32	information from the office at each meeting. At each meeting, the
33	office shall provide reports and information to the council on the
34	following:
35	(1) The state's efforts in encouraging the establishment and
36	growth of small businesses.
37	(2) How the office acts as a liaison and fosters cooperation
38	among small businesses and state, regional, and local
39	economic development officials.
40	(3) The methods by which small businesses interact with the
41	state and how these interactions may be streamlined,

especially with respect to how state government entities are



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1	working together to streamline permitting and licensing
2	processes and provide regulatory approvals.
3	(4) Promotion of tax incentives, grants, loans, and loan
4	guarantees designed to:
5	(A) encourage the establishment of small businesses; or
6	(B) assist small businesses that are expanding operations,
7	relocating operations to Indiana, or hiring or training new
8	employees.
9	(5) Programs that assist small businesses to access capital and
10	other private and public resources for financing expansion,
11	job creation, and job retention.
12	(6) Programs that assist small businesses in determining
13	availability and cost information concerning work sites,
14	workforce training, and infrastructure.
15	(7) Programs that assist small businesses in identifying state
16	procurement opportunities and other state initiatives that
17	support small businesses.
18	(8) Programs that encourage collaboration among institutions
19	of higher education, research institutions, certified technology
20	parks, small business incubators, units of local government,
21	venture capitalists, and economic development professionals
22	and organizations to promote the growth of small businesses
23	in Indiana.
24	(f) The small business council shall, before November 1 of each
25	year, submit a report to the legislative council:
26	(1) detailing the council's activities under this chapter during
27	the preceding state fiscal year; and
28	(2) recommending any legislation that the council considers
29	useful in coordinating and streamlining the efforts of state
30	government to assist and encourage the growth of small
31	businesses in Indiana.
32	The annual report submitted under this subsection must be in an
33	electronic format under IC 5-14-6.
34	SECTION 3. IC 4-4-35-5, AS ADDED BY P.L.187-2014,
35	SECTION 7, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
36	JULY 1, 2015]: Sec. 5. The office shall do the following:
37	(1) Operate the Indiana small business development center.
38	(2) Maintain, through the small business development centers, a
39	statewide network of public, private, and educational resources to,
40	among other things, inform small businesses of the state and
41	federal programs under which small businesses may obtain

3	(3) Employ a small business ombudsman.
4	(4) Support the development of small business in Indiana through
5	the Indiana small business development center.

7	(6) Develop and administer programs to support the growth of

9	(7) Provide reports and information to the small business
10	council as required by section 3.5 of this chapter.

12	SECTION 7, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
13	JULY 1, 2015]: Sec. 6. The office may operate a small business
14	assistance center to provide small businesses, including minority
15	owned businesses and businesses owned by women, with access to
16	managerial and technical expertise and to provide assistance in
17	resolving problems encountered by small businesses. The office may
18	not refuse to provide assistance or information under this chapter
19	to an individual or entity because of the:
20	(1) income or other compensation;
21	(2) credit history or credit score;
22	(3) employment history; or
23	(4) criminal history;
24	of the individual or entity.
