DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 20-34-10.

Synopsis: High school random drug testing. Provides that the governing body, or the equivalent, of each: (1) school corporation; (2) charter high school; or (3) accredited nonpublic high school; shall develop and implement a policy requiring random drug testing for high school students who participate in an athletic activity.
