DIGEST OF SB 150 (Updated February 11, 2021 11:54 am - DI 140)

Citations Affected: IC 32-31.

Synopsis: Housing matters. Eliminates the general restriction on the authority of a county, city, town, or township concerning regulation of landlord-tenant relationship matters not specifically described by state statute.

Effective: Upon passage.

SENATE BILL No. 150

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning property.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. IC 32-31-1-20, AS AMENDED BY SEA 148-2020, SECTION 17, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE UPON PASSAGE]: Sec. 20. (a) Subject to IC 36-1-3-8.5, this section does not apply to privately owned real property for which government funds or benefits have been allocated from the United States government, the state, or a political subdivision for the express purpose of providing reduced rents to low or moderate income tenants.

(b) A unit (as defined in IC 36-1-2-23) may not regulate rental rates for privately owned real property, through a zoning ordinance or otherwise, unless the regulation is authorized by an act of the general assembly.

(c) A unit (as defined in IC 36-1-2-23) may not regulate, through an
ordinance or otherwise, any of the following aspects of a
landlord-tenant relationship with respect to privately owned real
property located in the unit unless the regulation is authorized by an act
of the general assembly:

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(1) The screening process used by a landlord in approving tenants
