DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 36-8-16.8.

Synopsis: Public safety telecommunicators. Requires a public safety telecommunicator to successfully complete certain minimum basic training requirements and to annually complete 24 hours of continuing education.

Effective: Upon passage.

SENATE BILL No. 158

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning local government.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1 SECTION 1. IC 36-8-16.8 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE 2 AS A NEW CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE 3 UPON PASSAGE]: 4 **Chapter 16.8. Public Safety Telecommunicator Training** 5 Sec. 1. As used in this chapter, "board" means the statewide 911 6 board established by IC 36-8-16.7-24. 7 Sec. 2. As used in this chapter, "public safety agency" has the 8 meaning set forth in IC 10-10.5-1-5. 9 Sec. 3. As used in this chapter, "public safety 10 telecommunicator" has the meaning set forth in IC 10-10.5-1-6. 11 Sec. 4. (a) The board shall establish minimum basic training 12 requirements that meet or exceed the National Highway Traffic 13 Safety Administration recommended 911 minimum training 14 guidelines. 15 (b) The board shall establish criteria for certifying and 16 credentialing a public safety telecommunicator who completes a 17 minimum basic training program meeting the requirements

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1 established under this section.

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Sec. 5. (a) The board shall require each public safety telecommunicator to complete twenty-four (24) hours of continuing education training in each calendar year beginning after December 31 of the calendar year in which the public safety telecommunicator completes a minimum basic training program meeting the requirements established under section 4 of this chapter.

9 (b) The board may approve continuing education programs
10 offered by public safety agencies and providers other than the
11 board.

(c) A public safety agency or other provider of a continuing education program shall report and count an individual's completion of any approved program towards the individual's satisfaction of the annual requirement.

Sec. 6. After December 31, 2023, an individual may not work as
a public safety telecommunicator unless the individual has
completed the minimum basic training requirements established by
the board under section 4 of this chapter.

20 Sec. 7. A public safety telecommunicator must satisfy the 21 continuing education requirement imposed by the board under 22 section 5 of this chapter to remain eligible to work as a public 23 safety telecommunicator. Each year a public safety agency shall 24 report to the board the name of each public safety 25 telecommunicator employed by the public safety agency who 26 completes the twenty-four (24) hours of continuing education 27 required for that calendar year.

Sec. 8. Minimum basic training requirements established by the board before July 1, 2022, are legalized and validated. A public safety telecommunicator who has completed minimum basic training requirements legalized and validated by this section is considered to have complied with the requirements of section 6 of this chapter. The public safety telecommunicator is subject to the continuing education requirements of section 5 of this chapter beginning January 1, 2024.

Sec. 9. The board shall establish procedures and employ personnel as necessary to administer this chapter. The board may adopt rules under IC 4-22-2, including emergency rules in the manner provided under IC 4-22-2-37.1, to implement and administer this chapter.

SECTION 2. An emergency is declared for this act.
