DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 20-33-5; IC 20-51-4.

Synopsis: Curricular materials and school vouchers. Requires a new application form to be used to receive financial assistance for curricular material fees or to receive a choice scholarship. Requires schools to submit the individual applications to the department of education. Requires the department of education to submit 10% of the applications each year to the department of state revenue for income verification.

Effective: July 1, 2014.

SENATE BILL No. 162

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 20-33-5-4, AS ADDED BY P.L.1-2005, SECTION
2	17, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1,
3	2014]: Sec. 4. (a) The department shall provide each school
4	corporation with sufficient application forms for assistance under this
5	chapter. The department, in consultation with the department of
6	state revenue, shall prescribe the application form to be used. The
7	state board of accounts shall prescribe the forms to be used. approve
8	the application form. The application form must require at least
9	the following information:
10	(1) Personal identification information for the applicant and
11	student, including a copy of either a:
12	(A) current and valid photo identification; or
13	(B) current utility bill, bank statement, government check,
14	paycheck, or government document;
15	that shows the name and residence address of the applicant as
16	stated on the application.



1	(2) Sufficient documentation verifying the applicant's income.
2	(3) A notice to the applicant:
3	(A) that the information in the application and supporting
4	documentation will be shared with the department of state
5	revenue for income verification purposes; and
6	(B) that the applicant is verifying, under penalties for
7	perjury, that the information in the application and
8	supporting documentation is true, accurate, and complete.
9	(4) A place for the applicant to acknowledge that the applicant
10	understands the content of the notice required by subdivision
11	(3).
12	(b) A school corporation shall:
13	(1) retain each application and the supporting documentation
14	under subsection (a) submitted to the school corporation; and
15	(2) submit to the department a copy of all applications and the
16	supporting documentation under subsection (a) submitted to
17	the school corporation along with the school corporation's
18	request for a curricular materials fee reimbursement under
19	this chapter.
20	SECTION 2. IC 20-33-5-7, AS AMENDED BY P.L.286-2013,
21	SECTION 113, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS
22	[EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2014]: Sec. 7. (a) If a determination is made
23	that the applicant is eligible for assistance, the school corporation shall
24	pay the cost of the student's required fees.
25	(b) A school corporation shall receive a reimbursement from the
26	department for some or all of the costs incurred by a school corporation
27	during a school year in providing curricular materials assistance to
28	students who are eligible under section 2 of this chapter.
29	(c) To be guaranteed some level of reimbursement from the
30	department, the governing body of a school corporation shall request
31	the reimbursement before November October 1 of a school year.
32	(d) In its request, the governing body shall certify to the department:
33	(1) the number of students who are enrolled in that school
34	corporation and who are eligible for assistance under this chapter;
35	(2) the costs incurred by the school corporation in providing:
36	(A) curricular materials (including curricular materials used in
37	special education and high ability classes) to these students;
38	(B) workbooks, digital content, and consumable curricular
39	materials (including workbooks, consumable curricular
40	materials, and other consumable instructional materials that
41	are used in special education and high ability classes) that are
42	used by students for not more than one (1) school year; and



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- (C) instead of the purchase of curricular materials, developmentally appropriate material for instruction in kindergarten through the grade 3 level, laboratories, and children's literature programs;
- (3) that the curricular materials described in subdivision (2)(A) (except curricular materials used in special education classes and high ability classes) have been adopted by the governing body; and
- (4) any other information required by the department.
- (e) Each school within a school corporation **and the department** shall maintain complete and accurate information concerning the number of students determined to be eligible for assistance under this chapter. This information shall be provided to the department upon request:
- (f) Parents receiving other governmental assistance or aid that considers educational needs in computing the entire amount of assistance granted may not be denied assistance if the applicant's total family income does not exceed the standards established by this chapter.
- (g) The amount of reimbursement that a school corporation is entitled to receive shall be determined as provided in section 9.5 of this chapter.

SECTION 3. IC 20-33-5-9, AS AMENDED BY P.L.286-2013, SECTION 114, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2014]: Sec. 9. (a) If a parent of a child or an emancipated minor who is enrolled in an accredited nonpublic school meets the financial eligibility standard under section 2 of this chapter, the parent or the emancipated minor may receive a reimbursement from the department as provided in this chapter for the costs or some of the costs incurred by the parent or emancipated minor in fees that are reimbursable under section 7 of this chapter.

- (b) The department shall provide each accredited nonpublic school with sufficient application forms for assistance, **as** prescribed **by the department under section 4 of this chapter and approved** by the state board of accounts.
- (c) Each accredited nonpublic school shall provide the parents or emancipated minors who wish to apply for assistance with:
 - (1) the appropriate application forms; and
 - (2) any assistance needed in completing the application form.
- (d) The parent or emancipated minor shall submit the application to the accredited nonpublic school. The accredited nonpublic school shall make a determination of financial eligibility subject to appeal by the



1	parent or emancipated minor. The accredited nonpublic school shall:
2	(1) retain each application and the supporting documentation;
3	and
4	(2) submit to the department a copy of all applications and the
5	supporting documentation along with the accredited
6	nonpublic school's request for a curricular materials fee
7	reimbursement under this section.
8	(e) If a determination is made that the applicant is eligible for
9	assistance, subsection (a) applies.
10	(f) To be guaranteed some level of reimbursement from the
11	department, the principal or other designee shall submit the
12	reimbursement request before November October 1 of a school year.
13	(g) In its request, the principal or other designee shall certify to the
14	department:
15	(1) the number of students who are enrolled in the accredited
16	nonpublic school and who are eligible for assistance under this
17	chapter;
18	(2) the costs incurred in providing:
19	(A) curricular materials (including curricular materials used in
20	special education and high ability classes); and
21	(B) workbooks, digital content, and consumable curricular
22	materials (including workbooks, consumable curricular
23	materials, and other consumable teaching materials that are
24	used in special education and high ability classes) that are
25	used by students for not more than one (1) school year;
26	(3) that the curricular materials described in subdivision (2)(A)
27	(except any curricular materials used in special education classes
28	and high ability classes) have been adopted by the governing
29	body; and
30	(4) any other information required by the department.
31	(h) The amount of reimbursement that a parent or emancipated
32	minor is entitled to receive shall be determined as provided in section
33	9.5 of this chapter.
34	(i) The accredited nonpublic school shall distribute the money
35	received under this chapter to the appropriate eligible parents or
36	emancipated minors.
37	(j) Section 7(f) of this chapter applies to parents or emancipated
38	minors as described in this section.
39	(k) The accredited nonpublic school and the department shall
40	maintain complete and accurate information concerning the number of
41	applicants determined to be eligible for assistance under this section.
42	(1) The state board shall adopt rules under IC 4-22-2 to implement
