Synopsis: Voluntary manslaughter. Increases the penalty for voluntary manslaughter from a Level 2 felony to a Level 1 felony, if the offense is committed by means of a deadly weapon.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning criminal law and procedure.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 35-42-1-3, AS AMENDED BY P.L.158-2013,
2	SECTION 413, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS
3	[EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2016]: Sec. 3. (a) A person who knowingly or
4	intentionally:
5	(1) kills another human being; or
6	(2) kills a fetus that has attained viability (as defined in
7	IC 16-18-2-365);
8	while acting under sudden heat commits voluntary manslaughter, a
9	Level 2 felony. However, the offense is a Level 1 felony if committed
10	by means of a deadly weapon.
11	(b) The existence of sudden heat is a mitigating factor that reduces
12	what otherwise would be murder under section 1(1) of this chapter to
13	voluntary manslaughter.
