SENATE BILL No. 166

DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 25-23.6.

Synopsis: Behavioral health and human services professionals. Specifies that statutes concerning behavioral health and human services professionals may not be construed to limit social work or clinical social work services performed by an employee or staff member of a community mental health center. Removes board approval to take a licensure examination as a requirement for a temporary permit to profess to be a clinical social worker, marriage and family therapist, mental health counselor, licensed addiction counselor, or licensed clinical addiction counselor.

Effective: July 1, 2024.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning professions and occupations.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

5	who does not use a title specified in this article and who is one (1) of
6	the following:
7	(1) A licensed health care professional acting within the scope of
8	the person's license.
9	(2) A student, an intern, or a trainee pursuing a course of study in
10	medicine, psychology, or a course of study to gain licensure under
11	this article in an accredited eligible postsecondary educational
12	institution or training institution accredited by the Council on
13	Social Work Education, or a graduate accumulating experience
14	required for licensure if:
15	(A) the services are performed under qualified supervision and
16	constitute a part of the person's supervised course of study or
17	other level of supervision; and



1	(B) the student or graduate uses a title that contains the term
2 3	"intern", "student", or "trainee".
	(3) Not a resident of Indiana if the person performed social work
4	in Indiana for not more than five (5) days in any one (1) month or
5 6	more than fifteen (15) days in any one (1) calendar year and the
7	person is authorized to perform such services under the laws of
8	the state or country in which the person resides.
9	(4) A rabbi, priest, Christian Science practitioner, minister, or
10	other member of the clergy.
	(5) An employee or a volunteer for an organization performing

12	counseling, or other assistance.
13	(6) A person who provides school counseling.
14	(7) A governmental employee (as defined in IC 25-23.6-1-3.9).
