## **SENATE BILL No. 167**

#### DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

**Citations Affected:** IC 3-5-9.

**Synopsis:** Volunteer firefighters holding elected office. Deletes provisions that prohibit volunteer firefighters from assuming or holding certain elected offices.

Effective: Upon passage.

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January 8, 2014, read first time and referred to Committee on Local Government.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning elections.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:
