DIGEST OF SB 171 (Updated January 21, 2016 1:34 pm - DI 97)

Citations Affected: Noncode.

Synopsis: Study of electronic health care claim payments. Urges the legislative council to assign to a 2016 interim study committee the issue of use of electronic methods of health care claim payment.

Effective: July 1, 2016.

SENATE BILL No. 171

A BILL FOR AN ACT concerning insurance.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2016] (a) The legislative
council is urged to assign to an appropriate interim study
committee during the 2016 legislative interim the issue of use of
electronic methods of claim payment to health care providers.
(b) This SECTION expires January 1, 2017.
