SENATE BILL No. 172

DIGEST OF SB 172 (Updated January 6, 2020 12:50 pm - DI 133)

Citations Affected: IC 25-0.5; IC 25-41; IC 25-43; IC 35-52.

Synopsis: Licensure of behavior analysts. Provides for the licensure of behavior analysts and assistant behavior analysts. Requires a behavior analyst or an assistant behavior analyst to be certified by an approved certifying entity. Prohibits a person who is not licensed or exempt from licensing from practicing behavior analysis. Establishes penalties. Repeals current law that prohibits the use of certain titles unless the person is certified as a behavior analyst or assistant behavior analyst. Makes conforming changes.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning professions and occupations.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

Purpose; Definitions** 33 Sec. 1. The definitions in this chapter apply throughout this 34 article. 35 Sec. 2. "Assistant behavior analyst" means an individual who: (1) is certified by a certifying entity as a board certified 36 37 assistant behavior analyst; and 38 (2) meets the requirements under IC 25-43-3-2. 39 Sec. 3. "Behavior analyst" means an individual who: 40 (1) is certified by a certifying entity as a board certified 41 behavior analyst; and 42 (2) meets the requirements under IC 25-43-3-1.

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(1) a paraprofessional who practices under the close, ongoing supervision of a behavior analyst, assistant behavior analyst,

or health service provider in psychology; or

(2) an individual who is credentialed as a registered behavior technician by a certifying entity.

The term does not include an individual who does design
assessment or intervention plans or procedures unless the
individual delivers services as assigned by the supervisor
responsible for the behavior technician's work.

Sec. 5. "Board" refers to the Indiana behavior analyst licensing
 board established by IC 25-43-2-1.

Sec. 6. "Certifying entity" means the Behavior Analyst
 Certification Board, Inc., or any other entity approved by the
 board whose programs to credential practitioners of applied
 behavior analysis are accredited by the National Commission on
 Certifying Agencies or the American National Standards Institute.

18 Sec. 7. (a) "Practice of applied behavior analysis" means the 19 design, implementation, and evaluation of instructional and 20 environmental modifications to produce socially significant 21 improvements in human behavior. The term includes the 22 following:

23 (1) Empirical identification of functional relations between
24 behavior and environmental factors, known as functional
25 assessment and analysis.

26 (2) Applied behavior analysis interventions based on scientific
 27 research and direct and indirect observation and
 28 measurement of behavior and environment.

(3) Use of contextual factors, motivating operations,
antecedent stimuli, positive reinforcement, and other
procedures to help individuals develop new behaviors,
increase or decrease existing behaviors, and emit behaviors
under specific environmental conditions.

(b) The term does not include the following:

- (1) Psychological testing.
- (2) Diagnosis of mental or physical disorders.
- 37 (3) Psychotherapy.
- 38 (4) Cognitive therapy.
- 39 (5) Psychoanalysis.
- 40 **(6)** Counseling.
- 41 **Chapter 2. Board**
- 42 Sec. 1. The Indiana behavior analyst licensing board is

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1	established.
2	Sec. 2. The board shall do the following:
3	(1) Issue licenses to individuals who meet the requirements
4	specified in this article.
5	(2) Adopt rules under IC 4-22-2.
6	(3) Establish fees necessary to implement this article that
7	comply with the requirements under IC 25-1-8-2.
8	(4) Subject to IC 25-1-7, investigate complaints relating to the
9	practice of applied behavior analysis by a behavior analyst,
10	assistant behavior analyst, or other person alleged to have
11	violated this article.
12	Sec. 3. (a) The board consists of five (5) voting members
13	appointed by the governor as follows:
14	(1) Three (3) board certified behavior analysts who are
15	licensed under this article.
16	(2) One (1) board certified assistant behavior analyst who is
17	licensed under this article.
18	(3) One (1) public member:
19	(A) who is not and has not been a professional behavior
20	analyst;
21	(B) whose spouse is not and has not been a professional
22	behavior analyst; and
23	(C) who does not have and has not had a material financial
24	interest in the practice of applied behavior analysis.
25	(b) The Hoosier Association for Behavior Analysis and any
26	other group considered appropriate by the governor may submit
27	nominations to the governor.
28	(c) The terms and vacancies of members shall be filled as
29	follows:
30	(1) A vacancy occurring other than by expiration of a term
31	shall be filled for the remainder of the unexpired term by
32	appointment by the governor upon recommendation of the
33	board.
34	(2) The governor shall appoint members who reflect the
35	racial, gender, geographic, urban, rural, and economic
36	diversity of Indiana.
37	 (3) The term of a member is four (4) years. (4) A member may not serve more than two (2) successive
38	(4) A member may not serve more than two (2) successive
39 40	four (4) year terms. (5) Subject to IC 25.1.6.5.2. a member shall serve until a
40	(5) Subject to IC 25-1-6.5-2, a member shall serve until a
41	successor is appointed and qualified.

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1	(d) Each member of the board who is not a state employee is
2	entitled to the minimum salary per diem provided by
3	IC 4-10-11-2.1(b).
4	(e) Notwithstanding subsection (a) and IC 25-1-6.5-2(b), the
5	initial terms for members of the board appointed under this section
6	begin on July 1, 2020, and are as follows:
7	(1) For one (1) member appointed under subsection (a)(1) and
8	for the member appointed under subsection (a)(3), a term of
9	four (4) years.
10	(2) For the member appointed under subsection (a)(2), a term
11	of three (3) years.
12	(3) For one (1) member appointed under subsection (a)(1), a
13	term of two (2) years.
14	(4) For one (1) member appointed under subsection (a)(1), a
15	term of one (1) year.
16	However, the initial members appointed under this section are not
17	required to be licensed under this chapter but must apply for a
18	license as soon as feasible. This subsection expires July 1, 2024.
19	Sec. 4. (a) The board:
20	(1) shall meet at least twice annually; and
21	(2) may meet at other times as necessary, at the call of the
22	chair or by a majority of the members, to complete any
23	required business.
24	(b) Three (3) affirmative votes by members are required for the
25	board to take any official action.
26	(c) The board shall elect a chair from among the board's
27	membership on an annual basis.
28	Chapter 3. Licenses
29	Sec. 1. An individual who applies for a license as a behavior
30	analyst must meet the following requirements:
31	(1) Furnish satisfactory evidence to the board that the
32	individual is certified by a certifying entity as a certified
33	behavior analyst.
34	(2) Submit to a national criminal history background check
35	under IC 25-1-1.1-4 and furnish satisfactory evidence to the
36	board that the individual does not have a conviction for a
37	crime that has a direct bearing on the individual's ability to
38	practice competently.
39	(3) Furnish satisfactory evidence to the board that the
40	individual has not been the subject of a disciplinary action by
41	a licensing or certification agency of another state or

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1	jurisdiction on the grounds that the individual was not able to
2	practice behavior analysis without endangering the public.
3	(4) Apply for the license in the manner prescribed by the
4	board.
5	(5) Pay the fee established by the board.
6	Sec. 2. (a) An individual who applies for a license as an assistant
7	behavior analyst must meet the following requirements:
8	(1) Furnish satisfactory evidence to the board that the
9	individual is certified by a certifying entity as a certified
10	assistant behavior analyst.
11	(2) Submit to a national criminal history background check
12	under IC 25-1-1.1-4 and furnish satisfactory evidence to the
13	board that the individual does not have a conviction for a
14	crime that has a direct bearing on the individual's ability to
15	practice competently.
16	(3) Furnish satisfactory evidence to the board that the
17	individual has not been the subject of a disciplinary action by
18	a licensing or certification agency of another state or
19	jurisdiction on the grounds that the individual was not able to
20	practice behavior analysis without endangering the public.
21	(4) Apply for the license in the manner prescribed by the
22	board.
23	(5) Pay the fee established by the board.
24	(b) An individual who is licensed as an assistant behavior
25	analyst under this section must be directly supervised by a
26	behavior analyst who is licensed under this chapter or a health
27	service provider in psychology.
28	(c) An assistant behavior analyst must annually submit to the
29	board a written record of the supervision that is provided to the
30	assistant behavior analyst by a behavior analyst who is licensed
31	under this chapter or a health service provider in psychology.
32	Sec. 3. An individual who is licensed under this chapter must
33	comply with the requirements of the Professional and Ethical
34	Compliance Code for Behavior Analysts published by a certifying
35	entity.
36	Sec. 4. (a) A license expires on the date established by the
37	licensing agency under IC 25-1-6-4.
38	(b) To renew a license under this chapter, an individual:
39	(1) must pay the renewal fee not later than the expiration date
40	of the license; and
41	(2) submit proof of current certification by a certifying entity.

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1	Sec. 5. This article does not limit the use of applied behavior
2	analysis techniques by a person who does not use a title specified
3	in IC 25-43-4-2 and is one (1) of the following:
4	(1) A licensed or certified health care professional acting
5	within the scope of the person's license or certificate and
6	within the person's training.
7	(2) A student, an intern, or a trainee pursuing a course of
8	study to gain licensure under this chapter in an accredited
9	eligible postsecondary educational institution or training
10	institution.
11	(3) A person who is not a resident of Indiana, if the person:
12	(A) performs the services in Indiana for not more than five
13	(5) days in any one (1) month or fifteen (15) days within
14	any one (1) calendar year; and
15	(B) is authorized to perform the services under the laws of
16	the state or country in which the person resides.
17	(4) A behavior technician, or a family member implementing
18	a plan within the home, who acts under the extended
19	authority and direction of a behavior analyst or assistant
20	behavior analyst licensed under this chapter.
21	Sec. 6. If the board determines that:
22	(1) a person possesses a valid license from another jurisdiction
23	to perform acts that require a license under this chapter; and
24	(2) the jurisdiction issuing the license imposes substantially
25	equal requirements on applicants for the license that are
26	imposed on applicants for an Indiana license;
27	the board may issue a license to the person upon payment of the
28	licensure fee.
29	Chapter 4. Violations
30	Sec. 1. An individual who is not:
31	(1) licensed under this article; or
32	(2) exempt under IC 25-42-3-5;
33	may not practice applied behavior analysis.
34	Sec. 2. An individual may not:
35	(1) profess to be a licensed behavior analyst or licensed
36	assistant behavior analyst; or
37	(2) use the initials "LBA" or "LABA" or any other words,
38	letters, abbreviations, or insignia indicating or implying that
39	the individual is a licensed behavior analyst or licensed
40	assistant behavior analyst;
41	unless the individual holds a license under this article.

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Sec. 3. An individual who violates this article commits a Class
 C infraction.
