

SENATE BILL No. 176

DIGEST OF SB 176 (Updated January 16, 2019 11:23 am - DI 133)

Citations Affected: IC 25-26.

Synopsis: Transfer of prescription drugs. Allows a pharmacy to transfer, upon the request of a patient, a prescription for the patient that the pharmacy has received but not filled to another pharmacy. Sets forth exceptions.

Effective: July 1, 2019.

Grooms
