**Synopsis:** Adult protective services study committee. Requires the legislative council to assign the topic of adult protective service laws to an appropriate study committee during the 2015 interim.

A BILL FOR AN ACT concerning human services.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1 2	SECTION 1. [EFFECTIVE UPON PASSAGE] (a) The legislative council shall assign to an appropriate study committee during the
3	2015 interim the topic of adult protective service laws. The
4	committee shall do the following:
5	(1) Review and evaluate Indiana's adult protective services
6	laws.
7	(2) Review and evaluate Indiana's statewide adult protective
8	services units and programs.
9	(3) Identify and study the best practices for adult protective
10	service programs.
11	(4) Consider proposing a statewide program to assist with
12	county level adult protective service programs.
13	(5) Review programs in other states regarding:
14	(A) elder abuse prevention;
15	(B) financial exploitation of the elderly; and
16	(C) physical and mental abuse of the elderly.
17	(6) Evaluate whether funding for adult protective services is



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1	sufficient.
2	(7) Make recommendations, including recommended
3	legislation, to the general assembly on how to improve adult
4	protective services in Indiana.
5	(b) The committee shall issue to the legislative council a final
6	report containing the committee's findings and recommendations,
7	including any recommended legislation, in an electronic format
8	under IC 5-14-6 not later than November 1, 2015.
9	(c) This SECTION expires January 1, 2016.
10	SECTION 2. An emergency is declared for this act.
