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## SENATE BILL No. 182

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DIGEST OF SB 182 (Updated January 29, 2019 12:17 pm - DI 132)

**Citations Affected:** IC 9-13; IC 9-24.

**Synopsis:** Mobile credential. Requires the bureau of motor vehicles (BMV) to develop a system to issue mobile credentials. Requires the BMV to issue, upon request of an applicant, a mobile credential when the applicant satisfies the requirements for application for an identification card or various licenses and permits. Provides the BMV with rulemaking authority to implement the mobile credential system. Defines mobile credential. Makes conforming changes.

**Effective:** July 1, 2021.

 2 by subsection (b)(12) or (b)(13) for an individual who is less than  
 3 twenty-one (21) years of age at the time of issuance shall be **printed**  
 4 **notated** prominently on the identification card.

5 (d) If the individual complies with section 2(e) or 2(f) of this  
 6 chapter, an indication of the individual's veteran status or status as the  
 7 surviving spouse of a veteran of the armed forces of the United States,  
 8 as applicable, shall be shown on the identification card.

9 (e) If the applicant for an identification card submits information to  
 10 the bureau concerning the applicant's medical condition, the bureau  
 11 shall place an identifying symbol on the face of the identification card  
 12 to indicate that the applicant has a medical condition of note. The  
 13 bureau shall include information on the identification card that briefly  
 14 describes the medical condition of the holder of the card. The  
 15 information must be printed in a manner that alerts a person reading the  
 16 card to the existence of the medical condition. The applicant for an  
 17 identification card is responsible for the accuracy of the information

- 27 (1) a commercial driver's license issued under IC 9-24-6.1;  
28 (2) a commercial learner's permit issued under IC 9-24-6.1;  
29 or  
30 (3) a photo exempt identification card issued under  
31 IC 9-24-16.5.

32 **Sec. 3. (a) The bureau shall adopt rules under IC 4-22-2,**  
33 **including emergency rules adopted in the manner provided under**  
34 **IC 4-22-2-37.1, to administer this chapter.**

35 **(b) An emergency rule adopted by the bureau under this section**  
36 **expires on the earlier of the following dates:**

**"(c) The display of a mobile credential shall not serve as consent or authorization for the court, a police officer, or any other person to search, view, or access any data or application on the telecommunications device other than the mobile credential. If a person presents the person's telecommunications device to the court, a police officer, or any other person for the purposes of displaying the person's mobile credential, the court, police officer,**



**or person viewing the mobile credential shall not handle the telecommunications device in order to view the mobile credential and to verify the identity of the person."**

Page 8, line 29, after "2." insert "(a)".

Page 8, delete line 36, begin a new paragraph and insert:

**"(b) The bureau shall not issue a mobile credential for:**

**(1) a commercial driver's license issued under IC 9-24-6.1;**

**(2) a commercial learner's permit issued under IC 9-24-6.1;**

**or**

**(3) a photo exempt identification card issued under IC 9-24-16.5."**

Page 9, after line 5, begin a new paragraph and insert:

**"Sec. 4. The bureau may contract with a third party to carry out this chapter."**

Renumber all SECTIONS consecutively.

and when so amended that said bill do pass and be reassigned to the Senate Committee on Appropriations.
