DIGEST OF SB 182 (Updated March 20, 2019 9:40 am - DI 75)

Citations Affected: IC 9-13; IC 9-22; IC 9-24; IC 9-30.

Synopsis: Motor vehicle matters. Provides that the bureau of motor vehicles (BMV) may develop a system to issue mobile credentials. Provides that the BMV may issue, upon request of an applicant, a mobile credential when the applicant satisfies the requirements for application for an identification card or various licenses and permits. Provides the BMV with rulemaking authority to implement the mobile

Provides that an owner or last titled owner of a motor vehicle commits a Class C infraction when the owner or last titled owner of the motor vehicle abandons the vehicle. Provides that a unit or holder of a mechanic's lien including a towing service, city, town, or county shall forward a copy of the abandoned vehicle report including a copy of the complaint and summons to the public agency who placed the abandoned vehicle tag on the vehicle. Provides that the public agency shall send the complaint and summons by first class mail to the owner of the vehicle. Provides for the form for a complaint and summons for the offense of abandoning a vehicle. Provides a procedure to change the gender that appears on a driver's license, permit, identification card, or photo exempt identification card.

SECTION 2. IC 9-13-2-48, AS AMENDED BY P.L.198-2016, SECTION 104, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2021]: Sec. 48. "Driver's license" means **the following:**

(1) Any type of license issued by the state **in physical form** authorizing an individual to operate the type of vehicle for which the license was issued, in the manner for which the license was issued, on a highway. The term includes any endorsements added to the license under IC 9-24-8.5.

(2) **Except for a commercial driver's license issued under IC 9-24-6.1, any type of license issued by the state in the form of a mobile credential authorizing an individual to operate the type of vehicle for which the license was issued, in the manner for which the license was issued, on a highway. The term includes any endorsements added to the license under IC 9-24-8.5.**

SECTION 3. IC 9-13-2-74.5, AS ADDED BY P.L.184-2007, SECTION 8, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2021]: Sec. 74.5. "Identification card" means an identification document issued by a state government **either in physical form or in the form of a mobile credential** for purposes of identification.

SECTION 4. IC 9-13-2-103.4 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2021]: Sec. 103.4. **"Mobile credential" means a digital representation issued by the bureau under IC 9-24-17.5 of the information contained on the following:**

(1) A driver's license.

(2) A learner's permit.

(3) An identification card.

The term does not include a commercial driver's license or commercial learner's permit issued under IC 9-24-6.1 or a photo exempt identification card issued under IC 9-24-16.5.

SECTION 5. IC 9-13-2-123.5, AS AMENDED BY P.L.198-2016, SECTION 144, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2021]: Sec. 123.5. "Permit" means **the following:**

(1) A permit issued by the state **in physical form** authorizing an individual to operate the type of vehicle for which the permit was issued on public streets, roads, or highways with certain restrictions. The term **under this subdivision** includes the following:

(+) (A) A learner's permit.



1 (2) (B) A motorcycle permit.

2 (3) (C) A commercial learner's permit.

3 (2) A permit issued by the state in the form of a mobile
4 credential authorizing an individual to operate the type of
5 vehicle for which the permit was issued on public streets,

7 this subdivision includes a learner's permit and a motorcycle
8 permit. The term under this subdivision does not include a

13 either of the following:

14 (1) A legible photocopy of a reassigned vehicle title.

15 (2) A form document that includes the:

16 (A) address;

17 (B) date of sale or transfer;

18 (C) driver's license number;

19 (D) name; and

20 (E) signature;

21 of the person to whom a vehicle is sold or transferred.

22 (b) This section does not apply to an owner under section 8 of
23 this chapter or the last titled owner of a vehicle who:

24 (1) delivers:

25 (A) possession of the vehicle; and

26 (B) the applicable certificate of title;

27 to a subsequent purchaser or transferee; and

28 (2) possesses a record of sale for the vehicle that is delivered
29 to the subsequent purchaser or transferee.

30 (c) An owner under section 8 of this chapter or the last titled
31 owner who does not appear within the time specified to claim a
32 vehicle prior to a public sale under section 23 of this chapter
33 commits a Class C infraction.

34 (d) The unit or holder of a mechanic's lien including a towing
35 service, city, town, or county shall forward a copy of the
36 abandoned vehicle report including a copy of a complaint and
37 summons for a vehicle that is considered abandoned for purposes
38 of subsection (c) to the public agency who placed the notice tag
39 under section 11 of this chapter.

40 (e) Upon receipt of a copy of an abandoned vehicle report, the
41 unit shall send the complaint and summons for the abandoned
42 vehicle:



- (1) on a form that complies with IC 9-30-3-6(d);**
- (2) by first class mail addressed to the owner of the vehicle;**

- (3) postmarked not later than ten (10) days after the date the vehicle is eligible to be sold in a public sale under section 23 of this chapter.**

SECTION 7. IC 9-22-1-12, AS AMENDED BY P.L.125-2012, SECTION 119, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2019]: Sec. 12. **(a)** If a vehicle or a part tagged under section 11 of this chapter is not removed within the applicable period, the officer shall prepare a written abandoned vehicle report of the vehicle or parts, including information on the condition and missing parts. Photographs may be taken to describe the condition of the vehicle or parts.

(b) The written abandoned vehicle report should include a complaint and summons to be used under section 7.5 of this chapter that is on a form that complies with IC 9-30-3-6(d).

SECTION 8. IC 9-24-9-2.6 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE AS A **NEW** SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE UPON PASSAGE]: **Sec. 2.6. An applicant requesting to change the gender appearing on the applicant's driver's license or permit shall provide to the bureau a certified amended birth certificate showing the applicant's change in gender.**

SECTION 9. IC 9-24-11-4, AS AMENDED BY P.L.198-2016, SECTION 483, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2021]: Sec. 4. (a) **Except as provided in subsection (d),** an individual may not hold or possess more than one (1) credential at a time.

(b) An individual may not hold or possess:

- (1) a credential; and
- (2) a driver's license or identification card issued by a government authority that issues driver's licenses and identification cards from another state, territory, federal district, commonwealth, or possession of the United States.

(c) An individual shall destroy or surrender to the bureau any and all credentials, driver's licenses, or identification cards that would cause the individual to violate subsection (a) or (b).

(d) An individual may hold both a credential in physical form and in the form of a mobile credential issued under this article at the same time.

~~(d)~~ (e) An individual who violates this section commits a Class C infraction.



SECTION 10. IC 9-24-11-5, AS AMENDED BY P.L.86-2018,
SECTION 148, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS
[EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2021]: Sec. 5. (a) Except as provided in
subsection (d), a learner's permit or driver's license issued under this
article must contain the following information:

- (1) The full legal name of the permittee or licensee.
 - (2) The date of birth of the permittee or licensee.
 - (3) The address of the principal residence of the permittee or licensee.
 - (4) The hair color and eye color of the permittee or licensee.
 - (5) The date of issue and expiration date of the permit or license.
 - (6) The gender of the permittee or licensee.
 - (7) The unique identifying number of the permit or license.
 - (8) The weight of the permittee or licensee.
 - (9) The height of the permittee or licensee.
 - (10) A reproduction of the signature of the permittee or licensee.
 - (11) If the permittee or licensee is less than eighteen (18) years of age at the time of issuance, the dates, **printed notated** prominently, on which the permittee or licensee will become:
 - (A) eighteen (18) years of age; and
 - (B) twenty-one (21) years of age.
 - (12) If the permittee or licensee is at least eighteen (18) years of age but less than twenty-one (21) years of age at the time of issuance, the date, **printed notated** prominently, on which the permittee or licensee will become twenty-one (21) years of age.
 - (13) Except as provided in subsection (b), a digital photograph of the permittee or licensee.
- (b) The bureau may provide for the omission of a photograph or computerized image from any driver's license or learner's permit if there is good cause for the omission. However, a driver's license or learner's permit issued without a digital photograph must include a statement that indicates that the driver's license or learner's permit may not be accepted by a federal agency for federal identification or any other federal purpose.
- (c) A driver's license or learner's permit issued to an individual who:
- (1) has a valid, unexpired nonimmigrant visa or has nonimmigrant visa status for entry in the United States;
 - (2) has a pending application for asylum in the United States;
 - (3) has a pending or approved application for temporary protected status in the United States;
 - (4) has approved deferred action status; or
 - (5) has a pending application for adjustment of status to that of an



1 alien lawfully admitted for permanent residence in the United
 2 States or conditional permanent residence status in the United
 3 States;

4 must be clearly identified as a temporary driver's license or learner's
 5 permit. A temporary driver's license or learner's permit issued under

 33 permit or driver's license issued under this article must have the permit
 34 or driver's license in the individual's immediate possession when
 35 driving or operating a motor vehicle. The individual shall display the
 36 driver's license or permit upon demand of a court or a police officer
 37 authorized by law to enforce motor vehicle rules.

38 (b) **If the permit or driver's license is a mobile credential viewed**
 39 **on a telecommunications device, a court or a police officer**
 40 **authorized by law to enforce motor vehicle rules may not, without**
 41 **the consent of the person:**

42 (1) **confiscate a telecommunications device for the purpose of**



determining compliance with this section;

(2) confiscate a telecommunications device and retain it as evidence pending trial for a violation of this section; or

(3) extract or otherwise download information from a telecommunications device for a violation of this section unless:

(A) the court or police officer has probable cause to believe the telecommunications device has been used in the commission of a crime;

(B) the information is extracted or otherwise downloaded under a valid search warrant; or

(C) otherwise authorized by law.

(c) The display of a mobile credential shall not serve as consent or authorization for the court, a police officer, or any other person to search, view, or access any data or application on the telecommunications device other than the mobile credential. If a person presents the person's telecommunications device to the court, a police officer, or any other person for the purposes of displaying the person's mobile credential, the court, police officer, or person viewing the mobile credential shall not handle the telecommunications device in order to view the mobile credential and to verify the identity of the person.

SECTION 14. IC 9-24-16-3, AS AMENDED BY P.L.65-2017, SECTION 4, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2021]: Sec. 3. (a) An identification card:

(1) **in physical form** must have the same dimensions and shape as a driver's license; **and**

(2) **in the form of a mobile credential must have the same format as a driver's license;**

but the card must have markings sufficient to distinguish the card from a driver's license.

(b) Except as provided in subsection (g), the front side of ~~an~~ **a physical identification card or the top portion of an identification card in the format of a mobile credential** must contain the expiration date of the identification card and the following information about the individual to whom the card is being issued:

(1) Full legal name.

(2) The address of the principal residence.

(3) Date of birth.

(4) Date of issue and date of expiration.

(5) Unique identification number.

(6) Gender.



(7) Weight.

(8) Height.

(9) Color of eyes and hair.

(10) Reproduction of the signature of the individual identified.

(11) Whether the individual is blind (as defined in IC 12-7-2-21(1)).

(12) If the individual is less than eighteen (18) years of age at the time of issuance, the dates on which the individual will become:

(A) eighteen (18) years of age; and

(B) twenty-one (21) years of age.

(13) If the individual is at least eighteen (18) years of age but less than twenty-one (21) years of age at the time of issuance, the date on which the individual will become twenty-one (21) years of age.

(14) Digital photograph of the individual.

(c) The information contained on the identification card as required by subsection (b)(12) or (b)(13) for an individual who is less than twenty-one (21) years of age at the time of issuance shall be **printed notated** prominently on the identification card.

(d) If the individual complies with section 2(e) or 2(f) of this chapter, an indication of the individual's veteran status or status as the surviving spouse of a veteran of the armed forces of the United States, as applicable, shall be shown on the identification card.

(e) If the applicant for an identification card submits information to the bureau concerning the applicant's medical condition, the bureau shall place an identifying symbol on the face of the identification card to indicate that the applicant has a medical condition of note. The bureau shall include information on the identification card that briefly describes the medical condition of the holder of the card. The information must be printed in a manner that alerts a person reading the card to the existence of the medical condition. The applicant for an identification card is responsible for the accuracy of the information concerning the medical condition submitted under this subsection. The bureau shall inform an applicant that submission of information under this subsection is voluntary.

(f) An identification card issued by the state to an individual who:

(1) has a valid, unexpired nonimmigrant visa or has nonimmigrant visa status for entry in the United States;

(2) has a pending application for asylum in the United States;

(3) has a pending or approved application for temporary protected status in the United States;

(4) has approved deferred action status; or

(5) has a pending application for adjustment of status to that of an



1 alien lawfully admitted for permanent residence in the United
 2 States or conditional permanent residence status in the United
 3 States;

4 must be clearly identified as a temporary identification card. A
 5 temporary identification card issued under this subsection may not be
